A BILL

FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

- 1 "An Act relating to the Board of Professional Counselors; relating to licensing of
- 2 associate counselors; relating to marital and family therapists; relating to telehealth;
- 3 relating to review organizations and permitting an emergency medical services provider
- 4 to establish a review organization; relating to patient records; relating to disclosure and
- 5 reporting of health care services, prices, and fee information; relating to the health care
- 6 professionals workforce enhancement program; prohibiting unfair discrimination under
- 7 group health insurance against associate counselors; relating to medical assistance for
- 8 professional counseling services; relating to mental health professionals; relating to
- 9 health care provider liability; and providing for an effective date."
