# FOR AN ACT ENTITLED

# 1 "An Act relating to charitable gaming; and relating to pull-tabs and electronic pull-tab

2 systems."

# **3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

4 \* Section 1. AS 05.15.070 is amended to read:

5 Sec. 05.15.070. Examination of books and records. The department may 6 examine or have examined the books and records of a permittee, an operator, a 7 registered vendor, or a person licensed to manufacture or to distribute pull-tab games 8 <u>or electronic pull-tab systems</u> in the state. The department may issue subpoenas for 9 the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records, and other 10 documents.

(c) For a report required by this section, an operator may file one report for not
 more than 10 authorizing permittees who conduct activities at the same location. The
 operator may allocate taxes, prizes, and expenses in the same proportion that it
