| 26 | Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated         |
| 27 | from the named funds for the 2020 fiscal year to the state  |

agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

5 For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for 6 expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals 7 for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is 8 intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in 9 the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the 10 following definitions shall be applicable.

11 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total12 of all funding sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

18 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 19 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 20 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 21 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 22 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the
payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations
of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

"Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts 4 5 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, 6 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other 7 functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to be 8 9 paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other 10 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the 11 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not 12 13 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the 14 Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 15 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that regardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been 16 17 or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of 18 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be 19 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay 20 date falls.

15 Section 3. In addition to the amounts otherwise 16 appropriated in this act, there is hereby appropriated from 17 the several funds in the State Treasury, except the Education 18 Trust Fund, and in the same proportion as the salaries of the 19 several State officials and employees are paid, such 20 additional amounts as may be necessary to pay for a two 21 percent (2.0%) salary increase enacted in the 2019 Regular 22 Session. The additional amounts appropriated in this section 23 from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$12,000,000 for 24 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020. The Director of 25 Finance shall ensure that first priority shall be given to all 26 State General Fund payrolls, including the payroll of the Legislature. State agencies shall receive additional 27 allocations from the appropriation made in this section from 28 29 the State General Fund in amounts necessary to increase total

salaries paid from the State General Fund by two percent. The
 remainder of this appropriation from the State General Fund
 may be allotted by the Director of Finance to those agencies
 which receive transfers from the State General Fund.

5 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 6 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to the various 8 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 9 on September 30, 2019, are hereby reappropriated to the 10 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 11 2019.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 6. In addition to all other appropriations 18 19 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 20 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 21 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020. The 22 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 23 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the 24 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate 25 26 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval 27 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein

shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through
 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of
 Alabama 1975.

Section 7. Except as may be herein otherwise 4 5 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 6 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 7 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 8 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 9 10 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 11 herein except as may be further provided for under this act, 12 as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 13 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the 14 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 15 16 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80, et 17 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 18 19 1976, Sections 41-19-1, et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

20 Section 8. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 21 22 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 23 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 24 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 25 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 26 27 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

1 Section 9. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 2 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 3 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 4 5 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 6 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 7 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 8 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 9 10 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 11 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 12 13 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 14 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 15 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 16 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 17 18 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the 19 20 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

21 Section 10. The Department of Examiners of Public 22 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 23 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 24 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 25 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 26 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 27 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery
 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama
 1975.

Section 11. Upon certification to the Director of 4 5 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 6 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 7 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 8 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 9 10 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 11 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 12 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 13 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 14 15 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are 16 not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 12. All interest earned from funds paid into 17 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 18 19 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 20 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 21 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 22 23 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 24 25 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

26 Section 13. All encumbered balances of a previous 27 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations were made.

7 Section 14. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 8 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 9 10 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 11 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 12 13 this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 14 15 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 16 such services.

Section 15. All funds collected under Section 17 40-12-43.1, Code of Alabama 1975, between the effective date 18 19 of Act 98-191 and September 30, 2019 are hereby appropriated 20 to the Auburn University Center for Governmental Services for 21 the administration of the examiner certification program 22 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 23 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1, Code of 24 Alabama 1975.

25 Section 16. It is the intent of the Legislature that 26 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 27 Pro Tempore in subsection 6 of Section 2A of this act which are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate
President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized
for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
1975.

7 Section 17. The appropriations made herein to the departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 8 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 9 10 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 11 ending September 30, 2020. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance 12 program wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned 13 fixed rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 14 15 retired members.

Section 18. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the Deputy Director of the Legislative Services Agency-Fiscal Division of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act.

23 Section 19. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 24 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 25 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 26 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 27 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof
 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

3 Section 20. All laws or parts of laws, general,
4 special, private or local that are in conflict with or
5 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby
6 expressly repealed.

Section 21. Each agency of the state funded through the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 22. This act shall become effective October
 1, 2019.
