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ENROLLED, An Act,

Relating to the Permanent Joint Transportation 3 Committee; to amend Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4, 4 29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975; to provide for 5 6 technical corrections concerning the duties of the committee 7 as it relates to the Alabama Department of Transportation 8 long-range plan; to increase the number of members of the 9 Committee and specify their residency requirements; to provide 10 clarification of the long-range plan; and to provide 11 clarification of the Alabama Department of Transportation's duties and information requirements to the Committee relating 12 13 to the long-range plan. 14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA: 15 Section 1. Sections 29-2-1, 29-2-2, 29-2-3, 29-2-4, 16 29-2-6, and 29-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read 17 as follows: "§29-2-1. 18 19 "The Legislature hereby finds and declares as follows: A improving the efficiency, cost effectiveness and 20 performance of all branches of government can only be achieved 21

22 with proper oversight, accountability and transparency in

23 government decision making and processes for service delivery;

24 <u>a long-range program of highway development and maintenance</u> in
25 Alabama (herein <del>called</del> "the state") is vital to the <u>safety of</u>

1 the traveling public as well as the industrial and 2 agricultural growth and to the present and future well-being 3 of the citizens of the state; the highway system in the state must be adequate to meet such expanding needs; the highway 4 5 construction, modification, maintenance, and administration to 6 support such a system must should include long-range planning, 7 soundness in scope of the highway program, efficient 8 performance, and fiscal responsibility in both policy and planning; the use enactment of a long-range highway program 9 10 will further the judicious expenditure of highway funds, will 11 promote the public safety and convenience and public safety, will enhance public confidence in the responsible expenditure 12 of public funds, and will result in tangible benefits to the 13 14 public by providing a sound program to facilitate vehicular 15 traffic and safety; such a long-range program will establish 16 continuity in highway construction, modification, and 17 maintenance programs, thereby enabling the State of Alabama Department of Transportation (herein called "ALDOT" or "the 18 Transportation Department") to operate at maximum efficiency 19 with a greater returns in highway benefits for the amount of 20 21 public funds expended; all citizens and interested parties 22 should be aware of how their highway dollars funds will be 23 expended well as far in advance of such the actual 24 expenditures as possible; , and because changing of routes 25 affect people's travel times and patterns as well as property

1 values, all plans for such changes should be transparent and 2 made known to all citizens simultaneously well in advance of 3 their implementation; such a long-range program requires 4 advance consideration of priority of highway construction and 5 modification projects and of adequate budgets for highway 6 construction, modification, maintenance, and administration 7 achieving an appropriate balance in highway decision making is 8 an important goal; and, to the foregoing ends, it is desirable 9 to create a permanent joint transportation committee of the 10 Legislature which will develop expertise pertaining to highway 11 matters within both legislative bodies and which will insure 12 geographical balance in highway decision making the 13 development of highway plans and budgets for their 14 implementation is a primary responsibility of the Transportation Department working under the direction of the 15 16 Governor; effective highway state plans are well organized with defined processes for identifying all potential sources 17 18 of innovation, including by not limited to, broad stakeholder engagement and partnerships, shared performance metrics and 19 evidenced-based practices, adoption of the most cost effective 20 21 technology in materials and components of road and bridge 22 construction, and cost effective and efficient organizational 23 structures and operations; appropriate legislative oversight 24 procedures are necessary to fulfill the goals set forth above; 25 a Joint Transportation Committee of the Legislature will

1	develop expertise pertaining to highway matters within both
2	legislative bodies and will contribute actively to the
3	Legislature's deliberations with respect to highway funding
4	and plans; expertise pertaining to such highway matters may be
5	developed by evaluating best practices utilized in other
6	states to maintain efficient and effective transportation
7	projects and operations; a Joint Transportation Committee will
8	insure that ALDOT operations and road or bridge construction
9	projects are analyzed for efficiency and effectiveness; and
10	now therefore, the creation of such Joint Transportation
11	Committee is appropriate and desirable.
12	This article shall be liberally construed in order
13	to effect the purposes.
14	"§29-2-2.
15	" <u>(a)</u> There is hereby created a continuing permanent
16	joint transportation committee of the Legislature to be known
17	as the "Joint Transportation Committee." The committee shall
18	consist of <del>seven</del> <u>twelve</u> members of the Senate appointed by the
19	President of the Senate and <del>seven</del> <u>twelve</u> members of the House
20	of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of
21	Representatives, one senator and one house member to be a
22	resident of each present United States congressional district
23	in the state and one senator and one house member to be a
24	resident of each Alabama Department of Transportation region.

1	Of the total membership, a minimum of two members shall be			
2	from the Minority party.			
3	"(b) The members that reside in the Alabama			
4	Department of Transportation regions Members of the Joint			
5	Transportation Committee shall be appointed within <u>thirty days</u>			
6	of the effective date of this act; in subsequent years,			
7	members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be			
8	appointed within five legislative days after the convening of			
9	the first regular session after the election of each			
10	Legislature. Members shall hold office during their terms as			
11	legislators and until their successors are appointed.			
12	Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the respective			
13	presiding officer. <del>Appointees</del> <u>Appointments</u> shall be <del>residents</del>			
14	of the congressional district where the vacancy exists made in			
15	compliance with the residency requirements established by this			
16	<u>act</u> .			
17	"(c) The appointing authorities shall coordinate			
18	their appointments to assure the committee membership is			
19	inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban,			
20	rural, and economic diversity of the state.			
21	"§29-2-3.			
22	"Within 10 days after members of the Joint			
23	Transportation Committee are appointed as provided in this			
24	article, the committee shall convene at a place and time			
25	designated by the President of the Senate in written notice			

1 given to each member at least five days in advance or without notice upon unanimous consent of the members of the Joint 2 Transportation Committee The Joint Transportation Committee 3 shall meet the fourth Wednesday of January, April, July, and 4 5 October at 1:30 PM at the Alabama State House. At the second 6 quarterly meeting of each year, and at the initial meeting 7 during each session of the Legislature, the Joint 8 Transportation Committee shall elect from its membership a 9 chair and vice-chair which shall rotate between members from the House and Senate. Special meetings of the Joint 10 11 Transportation Committee may be called by the chair by giving members of the committee 14 days notice when the Legislature 12 13 is out of session, and 24 hours notice if a meeting is called 14 on a legislative day or legislative committee day. Special meetings may also be called by petition of a majority of the 15 16 members of the committee that includes the date and time of 17 the meeting and all members are given 24 hours notice. The 18 Joint Transportation Committee shall meet, at the request of 19 its chair or as its members shall determine, in both cases upon written notice at least five days in advance or without 20 21 notice upon unanimous consent of its membership; provided, 22 that the committee shall meet at least once each three months. 23 Decisions of the Joint Transportation Committee may be made by 24 a majority of the members present and voting at any properly 25 convened meeting as long as a quorum is in attendance. A

1 quorum shall consist of any eight thirteen members. If less 2 than a quorum is present at any meeting the recommendations presented by ALDOT shall be deemed approved. or any 3 adjournment thereof, those members who are present may adjourn 4 5 the meeting from time to time and a majority vote of the 6 members present shall be sufficient, without any notice other than by announcement at the meeting, to adjourn the meeting 7 from time to time until a quorum is in attendance. At any 8 9 adjourned meeting, any business may be transacted that might 10 have been transacted at the meeting as originally called 11 Beginning in calendar year 2020, should any member be absent from two meetings of the four quarterly meetings during any 12 13 calendar year, they shall be deemed to have forfeited their 14 position and a replacement shall be appointed by the 15 respective appointing authority as outlined herein. Upon the 16 request of the Chair, the Secretary of the Senate and the 17 Clerk of the House shall provide clerical assistance as the 18 committee requires. 19

"§29-2-4.

20 "(a) On or before January 31 of each year, any 21 county or city required to report local motor fuel excise tax 22 rate information to the Department of Revenue pursuant to Act 23 1998-192 shall provide a similar report to the department 24 regarding the total amount of local motor fuel excise tax 25 revenues collected by the county or city for the immediately

1	preceding fiscal year and the total amount of the revenues		
2	expended on road and bridge maintenance and improvement during		
3	that same fiscal year. The department shall collect the		
4	information and deliver a report to the Joint Transportation		
5	Committee on or before March 31 of each year.		
6	" <u>(b)</u> The powers and duties of the Joint		
7	Transportation Committee shall be the following as follows:		
8	"(1) It shall review <del>and concur in a</del> <u>and shall</u>		
9	consider concurring with the long-range plan of the		
10	Transportation Department as such plan exists at the date of		
11	the meeting called for the purpose of reviewing the plan. The		
12	"long-range plan" referred to herein is the Statewide		
13	Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) maintained by ALDOT		
14	for the purpose of complying with requirements of the Federal		
15	Highway Administration, which plan is amended multiple times		
16	each year for administrative as well as substantive reasons,		
17	and which plan shall be constantly available on the ALDOT		
18	website. A member of the Committee may propose an amendment to		
19	the STIP provided that the proposed amendment is delivered in		
20	writing to the Transportation Department by the close of		
21	business of the fourth Wednesday after the draft plan is		
22	presented to the Committee. The proposed amendment shall be		
23	fiscally constrained within the funding category shown in the		
24	draft STIP. The Department shall prepare the amendment and		
25	deliver to each member of the Committee no later than the		

1	fourth Wednesday of the month prior to the next quarterly
2	meeting. Should the Committee, by majority vote, accept the
3	proposed amendment, the amendment shall be delivered by the
4	Chair of the Committee to the Governor for consideration of
5	changing the STIP as presented by the Transportation
6	<u>Department.(five-year) federal-aid highway plan for proposed</u>
7	highway construction of all highways on the state highway
8	system, which long-range plan shall commence with the fiscal
9	year of the state beginning October 1, 1989. Prior to any
10	deviation from the intent of the five-year plan, the Joint
11	Transportation Committee shall review and concur in the
12	deviation, except commitments for highway projects necessary
13	for new or expanded industry. Commitments for these industry
14	projects shall be included in the next quarterly report by the
15	Department of Transportation. The plan shall be updated
16	annually. The plans in appropriate form shall be made
17	available to all government agencies and all members of the
18	public and news media.
19	"(2) The update of the Transportation Department's
20	annual fund allocation plan shall be presented to the Joint
21	Transportation Committee at the third quarterly meeting of
22	each year. The review and consideration of concurrence in the
23	annual update of the five-year highway plan shall be
24	accomplished by the Joint Transportation Committee <del>prior to</del>
25	September 1 no later than the last quarterly meeting of each

1 year. Failure of the Joint Transportation Committee to concur 2 in the annual update will not prevent the Department of Transportation Department from proceeding with any project. 3 "(3) The Transportation Department's requested 4 budget for the following fiscal year shall be presented to the 5 6 Joint Transportation Committee at the last quarterly meeting 7 of the year. It shall review the budget for highway 8 construction, maintenance, operation, and administration of 9 the Department of Transportation proposed by the 10 Transportation Department on an annual basis, which budget 11 review shall be reviewed completed not later than the fifteenth legislative day of each annual session of the 12 13 Legislature first quarterly meeting of each year. The Joint 14 Transportation Committee shall report on the budget requests 15 of the Transportation Department to the House Ways and Means 16 General Fund Committee and the Senate Finance and Taxation 17 General Fund Committee and may make recommendations about the 18 budget to the committees. 19 "(4) An in-progress draft of the Annual Report 20 outlined in Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 shall be 21 presented to the Joint Transportation Committee at the first 22 quarterly meeting of each year. All comments and input from 23 members of the Joint Transportation Committee shall be

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24 <u>delivered to the Transportation Department within 30 days of</u>

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1	<u>the first quarterly meeting to allow consideration by the</u>			
2	Transportation Department prior to publishing.			
3	" <u>(5) The Transportation Department shall prepare and</u>			
4	submit for review by the Joint Transportation Committee a			
5	long-range plan for the Department utilizing objective			
6	prioritization criteria consistent with the factors described			
7	in subdivision (11) at the first quarterly meeting of the			
8	year. The plan shall include a narrative of the condition of			
9	the Transportation Department as well as forward looking			
10	challenges and opportunities. The intent of this requirement			
11	is to allow the Joint Transportation Committee to assist in			
12	avoiding future problems and challenges and to assist in the			
13	development of goals for the Transportation Department. This			
14	plan may be incorporated into the Annual Report as required by			
15	Section 23-1-35, Code of Alabama 1975 or be prepared as a			
16	separate document.			

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17 "(4) (6) It shall issue a report to the Governor, 18 Lieutenant Governor, House of Representatives, and Senate, and public within 30 days of the first quarterly meeting the first 19 20 10 legislative days of each annual regular legislative 21 session, comparing actual performance of the <del>Department of</del> 22 Transportation Department in terms of highway construction, 23 maintenance, and costs of the same, to the original plan for 24 the immediate preceding fiscal year as well as the five 25 preceding fiscal years. It shall also make this report

## 1 <u>available to the public within forty (40) days of the first</u> 2 quarterly meeting.

3 "(5) (7) It shall recommend to the Governor
4 necessary funding for Department of <u>future</u> Transportation
5 <u>Department</u> budgets to the extent necessary beyond funds
6 already provided by law.

"(6) (8) It may retain the services of outside
consultants, if necessary, and consult with other groups and
individuals, including public interest groups, interested
individuals, and appropriate departments of the University of
Alabama, Auburn University, and other state educational
institutions.

13 "(7) (9) It may hold public hearings, shall make 14 diligent inquiry and a full examination of the long-range 15 future highway needs of the state, and shall file all reports 16 of its findings and recommendations with both houses of the 17 Legislature and with the Governor.

"(8) (10) It may call witnesses and do all things
 necessary or convenient in connection with and all things
 incidental to performance of the foregoing duties and powers.

21 "(9) (11) In performing its functions, the Joint 22 Transportation Committee shall take into consideration, in 23 determining reviewing plans for highway construction and 24 maintenance, among other factors all of the following:

1	"a. Commuter benefits in the <del>form</del> total amount of
2	direct savings to working men and women traveling to and from
3	their jobs in the state <del>.</del> ;
4	"b. Industrial and agricultural growth <del>.</del> ;
5	"c. Transportation safety <del>.</del>
6	"d. Ecological impacts of transportation projects <del>.</del>
7	"e. Recreation and tourism <del>.</del> ;
8	"f. Traffic density <del>.</del> ;
9	"g. Implications on the routing of school buses;
10	"h. Implications on the operation of public safety
11	and first responder vehicles.
12	"i. Priority to projects in a location with an
13	<u>independent local assessment.</u>
14	"j. Priority to projects which provide a county with
15	
	its first four-lane access to an interstate.
16	"§29-2-6.
17	" <u>(a)</u> The <del>Department of</del> Transportation <u>Department</u>
18	shall cooperate with the Joint Transportation Committee and
19	shall prepare or cause to be prepared and furnished to the
20	Joint Transportation Committee, by <del>July 1</del> <u>the third quarterly</u>
21	meeting of each year, the current long-range five-year
22	federal-aid highway plan, STIP for proposed highway
23	construction and any other reports, disclosures, information,
24	or data requested by Joint Transportation Committee. and the
25	Department of Transportation's The Transportation Department's

1	proposed annual budget <del>s, all as referred to in Section 29-2-4</del>
2	for the next fiscal year shall be prepared and furnished to
3	the Joint Transportation Committee by the last quarterly
4	meeting of each year. The Department of Transportation
5	<u>Department</u> shall <del>include in its current annual work program</del>
6	sufficient projects to insure the complete utilization of all
7	federal and state funds. It shall make available the books and
8	records of the <del>Department of</del> Transportation <u>Department</u>
9	necessary for the Joint Transportation Committee to perform
10	its functions and shall report to it quarterly on the
11	performance of the <del>Department of</del> Transportation <u>Department</u> for
12	the preceding fiscal quarter of the state and its proposed
13	projects and plans for the current fiscal year thereof. <u>The</u>
14	Transportation Department shall maintain the STIP in
15	accordance with requirements set forth by the Federal Highway
16	Administration. Additionally, the Transportation Department
17	shall include narrative language for each project in the STIP
18	describing in detail the scope of the project and the reasons
19	for its placement in the STIP. Whenever the plan is amended
20	for any reason, the Transportation Department shall, within
21	seven calendar days of such amendment: (1) update the ALDOT
22	website to disclose the change(s) made to the plan and (2)
23	notify, in writing, the chair of the Joint Transportation
24	Committee of the change(s) made together with appropriate
25	explanation of the change(s). Upon written request from the

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## chair of the Joint Transportation Committee, the

- 2 <u>Transportation Department shall provide copies of the notice</u>
  - 3 to all members of the Joint Transportation Committee.

4 "(b) The Transportation Department shall cooperate
5 with the Joint Committee to undertake a study on the use of
6 Federal Highway Administration Guidelines to include Life
7 Cycle Cost Analysis and Price Adjustment Clause.

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"§29-2-8.

"All bills originating in either house pertaining to 9 highway projects transportation under the jurisdiction of the 10 11 Department of Transportation Department, its budget, and all other matters of highway planning, construction, modification, 12 13 maintenance, operation, or administration shall be referred to 14 reviewed by the Joint Transportation Committee for its 15 recommendations and approval, which recommendations and 16 approval shall be given due consideration by the committees of 17 each house of the Legislature in acting on any related 18 legislation. Absent a recommendation from the Joint Transportation Committee, said committees shall proceed with 19 20 their consideration of legislation." 21 Section 2. This act shall become effective

22 immediately following its passage and approval by the 23 Governor, or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
