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ENROLLED, An Act,

To authorize the City Council of the City of Madison in Madison and Limestone Counties, pursuant to Amendment No. 373 of the Constitution of Alabama 1901, to increase the rate of the city general ad valorem tax levied and collected on all taxable property in the city authorized pursuant to the application provisions of the general laws of this state and pursuant to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, by an additional 12 mills on each dollar (\$1.20 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed value to be used exclusively for public educational purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. This act shall apply to the City of Madison in Madison and Limestone Counties.

Section 2. For the purposes of this act, the following words have the following meanings:

(1) AMENDMENT NO. 56. Amendment No. 56 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 216.04 of the Recompiled Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

(2) AMENDMENT NO. 269. Amendment No. 269 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 215.05 of the Recompiled Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

1 (3) AMENDMENT NO. 373. Amendment No. 373 of the
2 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 217
3 of the Recompiled Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

4 (4) AMENDMENT. NO. 805. Amendment No. 805 of the
5 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 14
6 Limestone County Local Amendments of the Recompiled
7 Constitution of Alabama of 1901.

8 (5) CITY. The City of Madison, Alabama.

9 (6) CITY GENERAL AD VALOREM TAX. The tax authorized
10 pursuant to the applicable provisions of the general laws of
11 this state and pursuant to Amendment No. 56 and Amendment No.
12 373 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, levied by the city
13 for general municipal purposes and general public school
14 purposes, and without express limit as to time.

15 Section 3. The city presently levies and collects
16 the city general ad valorem tax. Pursuant to a resolution
17 adopted by the City Council of the City of Madison after a
18 public hearing in accordance with Amendment No. 373, the City
19 of Madison proposes to increase the rate at which it may levy
20 and collect the city general ad valorem tax by an additional
21 12 mills (\$1.20 on each one hundred dollars) of assessed
22 value.

23 Section 4. Pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment
24 No. 373 and a resolution adopted by the City Council of the
25 City of Madison after a public hearing, the city may increase

1 the rate at which the city levies and collects the city
2 general ad valorem tax by a maximum rate increase for any tax
3 year equal to 12 mills (\$1.20 on each one hundred dollars) of
4 assessed value to be used and expended exclusively for public
5 educational purposes in and for the city.

6 Section 5. The increase in the rate at which the
7 city general ad valorem tax may be levied and collected
8 pursuant to this act is subject to approval by a majority of
9 the qualified electors residing in the city who vote on the
10 proposed increase at a special election called and held for
11 that purpose pursuant to subsection (f) of Amendment No. 373.

12 Section 6. The increase in the city of general and
13 ad valorem tax authorized by this act is exclusive of and in
14 addition to the one-half mill of ad valorem tax levied as a
15 special library tax pursuant to Amendment No. 269 and the ten
16 and one-half mills of ad valorem tax levied for public school
17 purposes in the Limestone County portion of the city pursuant
18 to Amendment No. 805.

19 Section 7. The increase in the maximum level of ad
20 valorem tax authorized pursuant to this act may be made
21 effective beginning with the levy for the tax year beginning
22 on October 1, 2019, for which tax year municipal ad valorem
23 taxes will become due and payable on October 1, 2020.

1 Section 8. This act shall become effective
2 immediately following its passage and approval by the
3 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
