8	Under existing law, the Code Commissioner
9	was directed to conform references in the Code of
10	Alabama 1975, to the offices, departments,
11	divisions, and other entities consolidated into
12	ALEA and to reflect the changes made by the

14	This bill would return the law enforcement

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26	Relating to the Alabama State Law Enforcement
27	Agency; to repeal Article 1 of Chapter 27 of Title 41,

comprised of Sections 41-27-1 to 41-27-9, inclusive, of the Code of Alabama 1975; to return the law enforcement functions consolidated within the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency to the offices, departments, divisions, and other entities and agencies with which they existed before the creation of ALEA and abolish ALEA; and to direct the Code Commissioner to make conforming changes in the Code of Alabama 1975.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. One year after the effective date of this act, Article 1 of Chapter 27 of Title 41, comprised of Sections 41-27-1 to 41-27-9, inclusive, of the Code of Alabama 1975, creating the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the Secretary of Law Enforcement and consolidating various offices, departments, divisions, and other entities into that agency, is repealed.

Section 2. (a) On the effective date of this act, all functions, powers, authority, duties, and jurisdiction and all books, records, funds, equipment, and personnel of the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency, established pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 27 of Title 41 of the Code of Alabama 1975, are transferred to and reestablished within the offices, departments, divisions, entities, and agencies in which they existed before January 1, 2015. The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall have one year from the effective date of this act to implement the transfers provided for in this act, and at that time, the various offices, departments, divisions, entities, and agencies consolidated into the

Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency shall exist and function 1 2 in the same manner as they functioned before January 1, 2015. (b) One year following the effective date of this 3 act, the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency is abolished. 4 Section 3. The Code Commissioner shall conform 5 references to the Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency in the 7 Code of Alabama 1975, to the units, departments, divisions, and other state entities as they existed before January 1, 8 2015. Code changes shall be made at a time determined to be 9 10 appropriate by the Code Commissioner. 11 Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and 12

approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.

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
