## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Alabama Historical Commission shall develop and implement a plan for the commissioning of monuments in dedication to and in recognition of Rosa Parks and Helen Keller, which shall include statues of Mrs. Parks and Miss. Keller which shall be located at an appropriate place on the Capitol grounds.

- (b) The commission shall solicit input from the public and other interested parties to develop the plan, including proposed design concepts for the monuments.
- (c) Non-state resources shall be used to defray all costs relating to the development and implementation of the plan, the design of the monuments, and any construction or other related costs associated with the placement of the monuments on the Capitol grounds.
- (d)(1) The commission may accept gifts, grants, and donations from non-state sources for purposes of carrying out its duties under this act.
- (2) State funds may be expended to implement this act.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
