9		against operating a school bus while talking on a
10		cell phone.
11		This bill would prohibit a school bus driver
12		from communicating on a cell phone while operating
13		a school bus.
14		This bill would provide penalties for
15		violations and exceptions.
16		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
17		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
18		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
19		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
20		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
21		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
22		becoming effective with regard to a local
23		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
24		unless: it comes within one of a number of
25		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
26		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

TO BE ENTITLED

13 AN ACT

To prohibit the use of a cell phone while operating a school bus; to provide penalties; to provide exceptions; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), no person may operate a school bus on a public street, road, or highway while also communicating on a cell phone.

1 (b) Any person who violates subsection (a) is
2 subject to a fine of up to one hundred dollars (\$100) for each
3 violation.

- (c) This section does not apply to an operator of a school bus communicating on a cell phone in the event of an emergency.
  - (d) For the purpose of this section, "cell phone" means a cellular, analog, wireless, or digital telephone device or similar device capable of sending or receiving telephone or text communications without an access line for service.

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
