21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
22	Section 1. Sections 1 and 2 of Act 2464, 1971
23	Regular Session, as amended, are further amended to read as
24	follows:
25	"Section 1. In Sumter County, the fee for issuance
26	of a permit to carry a pistol in a vehicle or concealed on or
27	about the person as provided in Section 13A-11-75 of the Code

of Alabama 1975, shall be fifteen dollars (\$15) twenty dollars 1 2 (\$20) each year, which shall be collected by the sheriff. "Section 2. Eleven dollars and twenty-five cents 3 (\$11.25) of each fee All monies collected under Section 1 4 5 shall be deposited by the Sheriff of Sumter County in any bank 6 located in Sumter County, into a fund known as the "Sheriff's 7 Fund." selected by the sheriff, into a fund known as the Sheriff's Pistol Permit Fund. The Sheriff's Pistol Permit Fund 8 9 may be drawn upon by the sheriff or his or her appointed agent 10 and shall be exclusively used for law enforcement purposes in the public's interest and in the discharge of the sheriff's 11 office as the sheriff determines. The Sheriff's Pistol Permit 12 13 Fund and the use of the fund shall not diminish or take the 14 place of any disbursement or other source of income 15 established for the sheriff or for the operation of his or her 16 office." Section 2. Section 3 of Act 2464, 1971 Regular 17 18 Session, as amended, is repealed. Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 19 20 first day of the third month following its passage and 21 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
