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8	SYNOPSIS:	Under current law, resisting arrest is a
9		Class B misdemeanor.
10		This bill would provide that resisting
11		arrest is a Class A misdemeanor and that resisting
12		arrest with a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument
13		is a Class C felony.
14		Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama
15		of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the
16		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
17		Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general
18		law whose purpose or effect would be to require a
19		new or increased expenditure of local funds from
20		becoming effective with regard to a local
21		governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote
22		unless: it comes within one of a number of
23		specified exceptions; it is approved by the
24		affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates
25		funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to
26		the entity for the purpose.

1	The purpose or effect of this bill would be
2	to require a new or increased expenditure of local
3	funds within the meaning of the amendment.
4	However, the bill does not require approval of a
5	local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3
6	vote to become effective because it comes within
7	one of the specified exceptions contained in the
8	amendment.

11	TO BE ENTITLED
12	AN ACT
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14	Relating to crimes and offenses; to amend Section
15	13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, to further provide for the
16	penalties for resisting arrest; and in connection therewith
17	would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new
18	or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of
19	Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now
20	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of
21	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
23	Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975,
24	is amended to read as follows:
25	"§13A-10-41.
26	"(a) A person commits the crime of resisting arrest

if he $\underline{\text{or she}}$ intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a

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1	peace officer from affecting a lawful arrest of himself		
2	<pre>herself, or of another person.</pre>		
3	"(b) Resisting Except as provided in subsection (c),		
4	resisting arrest is a Class $\frac{B}{A}$ misdemeanor.		
5	"(c) An offense under this section is a Class C		
6	felony if the person uses a deadly weapon or dangerous		
7	<pre>instrument in resisting arrest."</pre>		
8	Section 2. Although this bill would have as its		
9	purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased		
10	expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further		
11	requirements and application under Amendment 621, now		
12	appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of		
13	the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the		
14	bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an		
15	existing crime.		
16	Section 3. This act shall become effective on the		
17	first day of the third month following its passage and		
18	approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
