4	HJR EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE IRANIAN PEOPLES' DESIRE
5	FOR A DEMOCRATIC, SECULAR, AND NON-NUCLEAR REPUBLIC OF IRAN
6	AND CONDEMNING VIOLATIONS OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND
7	STATE-SPONSORED TERRORISM BY THE IRANIAN GOVERNMENT.
8	
9	WHEREAS, the First Amendment to the Constitution of
10	the United States guarantees freedom of assembly, speech,
11	and the right to petition the government for a redress of
12	grievances; the right to protest is also protected under
13	international human rights law by provisions enshrined in
14	various international and regional treaties guaranteeing
15	each of these distinct yet mutually reinforcing rights; but
16	many countries' governments do not offer these rights and
17	protections; one such nation is the Islamic Republic of
18	Iran; and
19	WHEREAS, beginning in 2017 and continuing for several
20	months, the Iranian regime suppressed economic, political,
21	and social protests with repressive forces that resulted in
22	at least 25 deaths and 4,000 arrests; and
23	WHEREAS, on November 15, 2019, popular protests
24	against the Iranian regime began and spread rapidly to at
25	least 100 cities throughout the country with reports
26	indicating that Iranian security forces used lethal force,

killing approximately 1,500 people in less than two weeks of unrest, and thousands more were detained; and

29	WHEREAS, beginning in September 2022, anti-government
30	protests, many of which were led by women and youths,
31	ignited in response to the death of Mahsa Amini, a
32	22-year-old Kurdish Iranian woman who was arrested by the
33	morality police that enforce Iran's mandatory dress code
34	laws; in retaliation, the Iranian regime's security forces
35	have killed hundreds and arrested tens of thousands of
36	protesters, two of whom, Mohsen Shekari and Majidreza
37	Rahnavard, were hung on December 8 and 12, 2022, in Tehran
38	and Mashhad, while dozens more have been convicted of
39	"Moharebeh" (waging war on God) and are at risk of
40	execution; and
41	WHEREAS, these protests are rooted in the more than
42	four decades of organized resistance against the Iranian
43	dictatorship, which most recently have been led by women who
44	have endured torture, sexual and gender-based violence, and
45	death; and
46	WHEREAS, the similarity in slogans and tactics used
47	by protests nationwide reflect the overarching demands of
48	the Iranian people for social freedom and political change
49	and point to the organized, unified national nature of the
50	protests; and
51	WHEREAS, in the 118th Congress, the House of
52	Representatives passed House Concurrent Resolution 7,
53	"Condemning the Iranian regime's human rights abuses against
54	the brave women and men of Iran peacefully demonstrating in
55	more than 133 cities"; House Concurrent Resolution 7 urges
56	the administration to support the people of Iran and calls

57	on the international community to publicly condemn violence
58	by the Iranian regime against peaceful protesters, to speak
59	out against violations by the regime of fundamental human
60	rights, including freedom of expression, assembly, and
61	redress of grievances of the Iranian people; and
62	WHEREAS, on November 24, 2022, the United Nations
63	Human Rights Council established a fact-finding mission to
64	conduct an independent investigation into the ongoing deadly
65	violence related to the protests in Iran that began on
66	September 16, 2022; and
67	WHEREAS, the Department of State's 2021 Country
68	Reports on Human Rights Practices, released on April 13,
69	2022, cites that Iran's "government and its agents
70	reportedly committed arbitrary or unlawful killings, most
71	commonly executions for crimes not meeting the international
72	legal standard of 'most serious crimes' or for crimes
73	committed by juvenile offenders, as well as executions after
7 4	trials without due process"; and
75	WHEREAS, senior Iranian government, military,
76	judicial, and security officials have for decades ordered or
77	committed egregious human rights violations and acts of
78	terror; the Iranian regime has arbitrarily and brutally
79	suppressed ethnic and religious minorities, including
30	Iranian Kurds, Baluchis, Arabs, Christians, Jews, Baha'is,
31	Zoroastrians, and even Sunni Muslims; deprived them of their
32	basic human rights; and has in many cases executed them; the
33	Iranian people have been denied fundamental freedoms, for
R 4	which reason they are rejecting dictatorship and religious

- WHEREAS, during the 2022 protests in Iran, tens of
- 87 thousands of Americans gathered throughout the United States
- 88 to call for the end of the Iranian regime and show
- 89 solidarity with the protesters risking their lives to
- 90 reclaim their country and establish freedom, human rights,
- 91 and democracy in Iran; and
- 92 WHEREAS, the Islamic Republic's malign activities in
- 93 the Middle East and around the world pose a threat to the
- 94 United States' national security interests and those of our
- 95 allies, including Israel; and
- 96 WHEREAS, senior Iranian government, military,
- 97 judicial, and security officials have ordered or committed
- 98 egregious human rights violations and acts of terror;
- 99 instead of representing the interests of the Iranian people,
- 100 the Iranian regime has long used its Foreign Ministry and
- 101 diplomatic representations abroad to orchestrate terror
- 102 plots and whitewash gross human rights violations in Iran;
- 103 and
- 104 WHEREAS, on July 2, 2018, the Belgian Federal
- 105 Prosecutor's Office announced it had foiled a terrorist plot
- 106 against the "Free Iran 2018-the Alternative" gathering held
- on June 30, 2018, in support of the Iranian people's
- 108 struggle for freedom; and
- 109 WHEREAS, Assadollah Assadi, a senior Iranian diplomat
- 110 based in the Iranian embassy in Vienna, Austria, was
- 111 arrested in Germany and in February 2021 was convicted in
- 112 Belgium and sentenced to 20 years of imprisonment in

113	connection with the planned terror plot in Paris at the Free
114	Iran gathering; Assadollah Assadi served as the third
115	secretary of the Iranian embassy in Austria; and
116	WHEREAS, on December 15, 2022, the Special Court for
117	Combating Corruption and Organized Crime in Albania
118	sentenced an Iranian national to 10 years in prison on
119	terrorism related charges, including attempts to engage in
120	espionage and the assassination of Iranian dissidents in
121	Albania; Iran's malign activities in the Balkans pose a
122	serious threat to the United States' national security
123	interests; and
124	WHEREAS, on November 23, 2022, the Department of the
125	Treasury announced additional action on Iranian security
126	forces, including Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps forces,
127	for their violent crackdown on anti-government protests in
128	Iran's Kurdistan Province and surrounding areas; Iran is
129	recognized as the number one state sponsor of terrorism
130	worldwide, and any actions to allow the Iranian regime to
131	facilitate nuclear or other terrorist plots must be
132	condemned; and
133	WHEREAS, Qasem Soleimani was the world's most
134	prolific terrorist, personally culpable for the deaths of
135	over 600 Americans and the maiming of thousands more,
136	including the torture and killing of tens of thousands of
137	people across the Middle East; he was personally sanctioned
138	by the United Nations and the European Union and was
139	designated a terrorist by the United States of America; the
140	strength and decisive action taken by former President

141	Donald J. Trump in eliminating Qasem Soleimani was a
142	monumental achievement in the War on Terror, sending a clear
143	message that the United States of America will not allow her
144	citizens to be attacked by terrorists without retaliation;
145	and
146	WHEREAS, the Iranian regime recently engaged in a
147	terror plot in Jordan that killed three American soldiers
148	and injured 40 more; and
149	WHEREAS, the members of this body condemn past and
150	present Iranian state-sponsored terrorist attacks against
151	United States citizens and officials as well as Iranian
152	dissidents, including the Iranian regime's terror plot
153	against the "Free Iran 2018-the Alternative" gathering in
154	Paris; now therefore,
155	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH
156	HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the members of this body
157	call on relevant United States government agencies to work
158	with European allies, including those in the Balkans where
159	Iran has expanded its presence, to hold Iran accountable for
160	breaching diplomatic privileges; we also call on nations to
161	prevent the malign activities of the Iranian regime's
162	diplomatic missions with the goal of closing them down and
163	expelling its agents.
164	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of this body
165	stand with the people of Iran who are legitimately defending
166	their rights for freedom against repression as well as
167	condemn the brutal killing of Iranian protesters by the
168	regime.



169	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members of this body
170	recognize the rights of the Iranian people and their
171	struggle to establish a democratic, secular, and non-nuclear
172	Republic of Iran with the right to vote, free elections, and
173	ethnic equality, as well as a foreign policy based on
174	peaceful coexistence.
