23	for the Montgomery Community Action Agency Head Start Program;
24	she also drove for Capital Trailways of Alabama; and
25	WHEREAS, despite her driving experience, the City of
26	Montgomery denied her employment; her perseverance earned her
27	the proclaimed title as the first female bus driver and the
