these medicines saved the health care system as much as \$7.00 resulting in a \$102 billion annual savings; and

3 WHEREAS, self-care can reduce unnecessary visits to 4 health care practitioners, saving consumers and government 5 money while allowing doctors and nurses to spend more time 6 with patients who require their special expertise; and

7 WHEREAS, Alabama benefits when its citizens practice 8 appropriate self-care, and the citizens are empowered by 9 higher self-esteem, improved health, and reduced use of health 10 care services; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we encourage consumers, health care practitioners, policymakers, and regulators to communicate the benefits of self-care and recognize April 2019 as Self-Care Awareness Month in Alabama.

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
