10	SUPPORT VETERANS BY ESTABLISHING VETERANS HOMES IN OPP AND
11	HARTSELLE.
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13	WHEREAS, America's veterans have served with valor
14	and distinction on behalf of a very grateful nation, and it is
15	our societal duty to give back to those brave individuals who
16	have risked their lives and made immeasurable sacrifices in
17	defending our freedom and democracy; and
18	WHEREAS, providing our aging veteran population with
19	the means to adequate health, safety, and welfare should be a
20	top priority of our state; and
21	WHEREAS, currently the Alabama Department of
22	Veterans Affairs in partnership with the U.S. Department of
23	Veterans Affairs operates four state veterans homes located in
24	Alexander City, Huntsville, Bay Minette, and Pell City; these
25	homes provide nursing home level care and other critical needs

for veterans with dementia and similar conditions, as well as

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assisted living-type care with basic needs, such as preparing meals, to veterans who are mobile enough to come and go; and WHEREAS, there are waiting lists for all four homes and the wait times vary from three months to 24 months, depending on the facility; veterans can be on a waiting list for more than one home and once admitted, can remain on a list

for a preferred home; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs conducted a feasibility study to determine if a fifth state veterans home is needed and the report recommended that an additional state veterans home be placed in the region of the state that includes Barbour, Butler, Coffee, Covington, Crenshaw, Dale, Geneva, Henry, Houston, and Pike Counties; and

WHEREAS, there are federal funds available that would pay approximately two-thirds of the cost to build a new fifth facility and the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs Commissioner believes that there are sufficient funds in the budget to pay the other one-third of the cost to build a new facility; and

WHEREAS, since there are no state or federal veterans homes in the Wiregrass area, locating a new state veterans home in Opp, Alabama, would provide the veterans in the southeast region of the state with access to the health care that they desperately need; additionally, the now closed and vacant Hartselle Medical Center in Hartselle, Alabama, has been proposed as an additional site to open another state

veterans home, providing a sixth facility to assist and serve
the growing veteran population of our state; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, That we urge the U.S. Department
of Veterans Affairs and the Alabama Department of Veterans

Affairs to assist and support the veterans of our state by
establishing two new state veterans homes in Opp and

Hartselle, Alabama.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we direct that copies of this resolution be delivered to the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the Commissioner of the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs.
