8	SYNOPSIS:	Under Article VI, Sections 156, 157, and 158
9		of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution
10		of Alabama of 1901, as amended, the Judicial
11		Inquiry Commission is created to investigate and
12		receive or initiate complaints relating to any
13		judge in the state and the Court of the Judiciary
14		is created to hear complaints filed by the Judicial
15		Inquiry Commission.
16		This bill would propose an amendment to the
17		Constitution of Alabama of 1901, to abolish the
18		Judicial Inquiry Commission and the Court of the
19		Judiciary.
20		Under Article VI, Section 159 of the
21		Official Recompilation of the Constitution of
22		Alabama of 1901, as amended, a judge is
23		disqualified from acting as judge when a complaint
24		has been filed against him or her by the Judicial
25		Inquiry Commission with the Court of the Judiciary.
26		This bill would propose an amendment to
27		Section 159 of the Official Recompilation of the

2	references to the Judicial Inquiry Commission and

20	appearing as Section 159 of the Official Recompilation of the
21	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, to delete

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The following amendment to the
26	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is proposed and

majority of the qualified electors voting thereon and in accordance with Sections 284, 285, and 287 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended:

## PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Part 1. Sections 6.17 and 6.18, as added by
Amendment 328, as amended by Amendment 581 to the Constitution
of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 156 and 157,
respectively, of the Official Recompilation of the
Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, and Section
6.18A, as added by Amendment 580 to the Constitution of
Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 158 of the Official
Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as
amended, relating to the Judicial Inquiry Commission and the
Court of the Judiciary, are repealed.

Part 2. Section 6.19, as added by Amendment 328 to the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 159 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 6.19.

"A judge shall be disqualified from acting as a judge, without loss of salary, while there is pending (1) an indictment or an information charging him or her in the United States with a crime punishable as a felony under a state or federal law, or (2) a complaint against him filed by the judicial inquiry commission with the court of the judiciary."

Section 2. An election upon the proposed amendment shall be held in accordance with Sections 284 and 285 of the

1	Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Sections 284

5	Section 3. The appropriate election official shall

11	Alabama of 1901, to abolish the Judicial Inquiry Commission

13	"Proposed by Act"
14	This description shall be followed by the following
15	language:
