6	TO BE ENTITLED
7	AN ACT
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9	Relating to the Alabama Department of Public Health; to
10	amend Sections 22-1-1, 22-2-1, 22-2-4, 22-2-5, 22-2-6, and
11	22-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, to abolish the State Board of
12	Health and confer all duties and authorities provided by law
13	to the State Committee of Public Health; to revise the
14	membership of the State Committee of Public Health; to
15	provide minimum qualifications for the State Health Officer;
16	to provide a mechanism to require the State Committee of
17	Public Health to review certain official actions taken by the
18	State Health Officer and take disciplinary action against the
19	State Health Officer; to add Section 22-2-8.1 to the Code of
20	Alabama 1975, to require certain emergency rules, orders, or
21	directives issued by the State Health Officer to be approved
22	by the Governor and a copy to be filed with the Secretary of
23	State before the emergency rule, order, or other directive has
24	the full force and effect of law; and to make nonsubstantive,
25	technical revisions to update the existing code language to
26	current style.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
28	Section 1. Sections 22-1-1, 22-2-1, 22-2-4, 22-2-5,



29 22-2-6, and 22-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, are amended to read 30 as follows: "\$22-1-1 31 32 For the purposes of this title, the phrase "State 33 Health Department" code, the Alabama Department of Public 34 Health shall mean the State Board of Health or the State 35 Committee of Public Health, when acting for the State Board of 36 Health." "\$22-2-1 37 The Medical Association of the State of Alabama, as 38 39 constituted under the laws now in force or which hereafter may be in force, is the The State Board of Health is abolished. 40 41 All powers and duties of the State Board of Health, as those powers and duties exist on September 30, 2024, are conferred 42 43 upon the State Committee of Public Health created under Section 22-2-4, and the State Committee of Public Health shall 44 45 act as the State Board of Health for purposes of this code." 46 "\$22-2-4 47 (a) There is hereby created a State Committee of Public Health. which shall be composed of 12 members of the board of 48 49 censors of the Medical Association of the State of Alabama and 50 the chairman Beginning October 1, 2024, the committee shall 51 consist of: 52 (1) The chairs of the four councils which are created 53 in Section 22-2-9; 54 (2) The Governor or his or her designee; (3) One physician from each Congressional district 55 56 appointed by the Medical Association of the State of Alabama; -



57	The medical doctor members of the committee shall be selected
58	by the State Board of Health, one from each of the United
59	States congressional districts and the remainder from the
60	state at large.
61	(4) One physician appointed by the Alabama Medical
62	Directors Association;
63	(5) One physician appointed by the Alabama State
64	Society of Anesthesiologists; and
65	(6) Two physicians practicing medicine in rural areas,
66	one physician appointed by the Alabama Academy of Family
67	Physicians, and the other physician being an
68	obstetrician-gynecologist appointed by the Alabama Chapter of
69	the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists.
70	(b) All physician members of the State Committee of
71	Public Health shall be residents of this state and shall be
72	licensed to practice medicine by the Medical Licensure
73	Commission of Alabama.
74	(c) A majority of the membership of the State Committee
75	of Public Health shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman
76	<u>chair and a vice-chair to serve one term of four years. Upon</u>
77	incapacitation or resignation of the chairman, the
78	vice-chairmanIf the chair is unable to serve, the vice-chair
79	shall succeed to the chairmanship <u>p</u>osition of chair of the
80	committee. Each member of the State Committee of Public Health
81	shall have one vote, except the chairman <u>chair</u> who shall vote
82	only in case of a tie. The State Health Officer shall be ex
83	officio secretary to the committee, though not a member
84	thereof, and he or she shall have no vote.



85 (d) The members of the committee shall receive per diem 86 at a rate of \$100.00 one hundred dollars (\$100) per day or any portion thereof that such committee members shall be when in 87 88 attendance at an official meeting or function of the 89 committee. In addition, each committee member shall receive 90 reimbursement for subsistence and travel in accordance with 91 state law for each day actively engaged in the duties of 92 their his or her office." "\$22-2-5 93 Whenever the words "State Board of Health" are used in 94 95 this title, or in any chapter or subsection thereof, said code, the words shall mean the "State Committee of Public 96 97 Health," as created in Section 22-2-4, except when the State Board of Health is in actual session assembled. The State 98 99 Committee of Public Health, as constituted by this chapter, shall have and possess all the prerogatives and powers and 100 duties heretofore prescribed by law for the State Board of 101 102 Health and shall act for said board. The State Board of Health 103 may by a three-fifths vote alter or amend any action of the State Committee of Public Health, but only when said board is 104 105 in session assembled."

107 <u>(a) When the State Board of Health is not in session,</u> 108 the State Committee of Public Health shall act for said board 109 and have and discharge all the prerogatives and duties of said 110 board, including the adoption and promulgation of rules and 111 regulations. Meetings of the State Committee of Public Health 112 shall be held monthly. A majority of the members shall



113	constitute a quorum. Special meetings of the committee may be
114	called by the chairman <u>chair</u>upon 10 days prior written notice
115	to the <u>committee</u> members thereof.
116	(b) The State Committee of Public Health shall adopt
117	rules as necessary to promote and maintain public health in
118	this state."

120	(a) The State Committee of Public Health shall elect an
121	executive officer who shall be Governor shall appoint, from a
122	list of names submitted by the State Committee of Public
123	<u>Health,</u> a physician licensed in the State of Alabama to be
124	known as the State Health Officer-and. The State Committee of
125	Public Health shall fix his or her term of office and salary.
126	The qualifications of this individual shall be determined by
127	the State Committee of Public Health, which, at a minimum,
128	shall include possession of a full, active, and unrestricted
129	license to practice medicine in Alabama.
130	Before entering upon the duties of his office, the
131	State Health Officer shall execute to the State of Alabama a
132	bond, to be approved by the Governor, in the amount
133	of\$5,000.00, for the faithful performance of his duties.
134	(b)(1) The State Health Officer, so elected shall,
135	under the direction of the State Committee of Public Health
136	and with the approval of the State Personnel Board, <u>shall</u> fix
137	the salaries of the medical employees of the State Committee
138	of Public Health. When the State Committee of Public Health is
139	not in session, the State Health Officer, as executive officer
140	of the <u>Alabama</u> Department of Public Health, shall act for said



141 the committee and shall have and discharge all the 142 prerogativespowers and duties of said the committee. He The 143 State Health Officer shall report his or her actions to the 144 committee at its next meeting after such the action is taken, 145 and such the action of the State Health Officer shall then be 146 subject to confirmation or modification by the committee. 147 (2) If the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of 148 the House of Representatives, or President Pro Tempore of the 149 Senate determine, in his or her opinion, that the State Health Officer has taken an official action that exceeds the State 150 151 Health Officer's statutory authority in a manner that demonstrates a willful disregard for the office, he or she may 152 153 petition the State Committee of Public Health to determine whether the State Health Officer should be disciplined and 154 155 whether the official action should be modified, reversed, or affirmed. Disciplinary action may include removal from office. 156 157 This review shall be initiated within 30 days of receipt of 158 written notice sent by certified mail to the Chair of the State Committee of Public Health. 159

160 (c) The State Health Officer shall exercise general 161 supervision over county boards of health and county health 162 officers and promptly report to <u>said the</u> county boards of 163 health any delinquencies of official duty on the part of <u>said</u> 164 <u>a</u> county health <u>officers officer</u> which may come to his <u>or her</u> 165 knowledge<u>.</u>, keep himself informed in regard to all diseases 166 <u>which may be in danger of invading the state</u>

167 (d) The State Health Officer shall stay informed with
168 regard to an actual or potential outbreak of any disease



169 affecting the state and, as far as authorized by law, take 170 prompt measures to prevent such invasions an outbreak and keep 171 the Governor and the Legislature informed as to the health 172 conditions prevailing in the state, especially as to outbreaks 173 of any of the diseases enumerated in Chapter 11 of this 174 title11A, and submit to the Governor and Legislature such 175 recommendations as he or she deems proper to control, such 176 outbreaksprevent, or minimize the outbreak."

177 Section 2. Section 22-2-8.1 is added to the Code of 178 Alabama 1975, to read as follows:

\$22-2-8.1

(a) An emergency rule, order, or directive relating to
containment or mitigation measures to address a disease
outbreak that is generally applicable to the public at large,
or to businesses, institutions, or other entities, shall not
be effective unless the rule, order, or directive is first
approved by the Governor and a copy is filed in the Office of
the Secretary of State.

(b) Subsection (a) does not prohibit or restrict the
State Health Officer from issuing individualized orders or
directives to persons for violations of public health laws
under Title 22, Code of Alabama 1975, or rules adopted
thereunder, or closure of certain state waters for oyster
harvesting. Individualized orders or directives include, but
are not limited to, all of the following:

(1) Emergency suspensions or proposed revocations of
 permits, licenses, or authorizations to engage in activities
 governed by public health laws or rules thereunder.



197 (2) Fines issued for violations of public health laws.
198 (3) Directives to destroy adulterated or contaminated
199 food, milk, or milk products.

200 (4) Directives to abate unsanitary conditions caused or
201 maintained by a person which are, or are likely to become,
202 menaces to public health.

203 (5) Quarantine or isolation orders issued to 204 individuals having, or suspected of having, a communicable 205 disease.

(c) The State Health Officer shall report emergency rules, orders, and directives he or she issues to the State Committee of Public Health at its next meeting after the action is taken, and the action shall then be subject to confirmation or modification by the committee.

(d) Nothing in this section shall permit the State Health Officer or Governor to require an individual resident to be vaccinated against COVID-19 or any variant thereof.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on October 1, 2024; provided, however, the provisions of Section 22-2-8, Code of Alabama 1975, providing for the appointment of a State Health Officer by the Governor shall become operative when a vacancy occurs in the Office of the State Health Officer on or after October 1, 2024.
