14	(a) The task force shall consist of the following

16	(1) Two members appointed by the President Pro

20	(2) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the

22	licensed wine retailer in the state, and one of whom shall
23	represent a shipping and delivery business.
24	(3) Two members of the Senate, one of whom shall be
25	a member of the minority party, appointed by the President Pro
26	Tempore of the Senate.

- 1 (4) Two members of the House of Representatives, one 2 of whom shall be a member of the minority party, appointed by 3 the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - (5) A representative of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, appointed by the board.

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- (b) The appointing authorities shall coordinate their appointments to assure the task force membership is inclusive and reflects the racial, gender, geographic, urban, rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (c) The first meeting of the task force shall be called by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. At the first meeting, the task force shall elect a chair and vice-chair.
- (d) The task force shall examine other states' laws regarding the direct shipment of alcoholic beverages from producers or retailers to customers, particularly under circumstances where other states use a 3-tier system of regulating alcoholic beverages, and how direct shipment of wine would impact Alabama's existing regulatory structure and its licensed manufacturers, distributors, and retailers under the 3-tier system and the benefits of authorizing direct shipment.
- (e) The goal of the task force is to determine whether the direct shipment of wine would benefit the state as a whole, while protecting current businesses and ensuring that alcohol is delivered in a responsible manner.

(f) The task force shall hold a minimum of two

public hearings to receive input from the public and from

individuals and businesses involved in the manufacturing,

distribution, and retail sale of wine and from common carriers

and other businesses involved in shipping and delivery.

- (g) Each legislative member of the task force shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day of attendance at a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901.
- (h) Not later than December 1, 2020, the task force shall report its findings, including any legislative recommendations, to the Legislature. Upon submission of its report, the task force shall be dissolved.
