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4	SJR EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR INVESTMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF
5	INFRASTRUCTURE FOR TRUCK PARKING.
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7	WHEREAS, the purpose of this resolution is to
8	strongly urge the Governor of the State of Alabama, the
9	Alabama Department of Transportation, and the Alabama
10	Legislature to consider the critical lack of adequate truck
11	parking in the State of Alabama and support policies to
12	invest in the long-term viability of truck parking; and
13	WHEREAS, trucking is critical to the overall economy
14	of the State of Alabama; trucking employs more than 125,000
15	working Alabamians; 32,000 trucking companies call Alabama
16	home; trucking moves 81 percent of all manufactured tonnage
17	in Alabama; and 86 percent of Alabama communities are fully
18	reliant on trucks to deliver their goods; and
19	WHEREAS, the scarcity of truck parking has dire
20	safety implications for both truck drivers and the motoring
21	public, resulting in far too many truck drivers parking in
22	unsafe and unsanctioned places out of necessity; and
23	WHEREAS, the lack of safe parking areas makes it
24	challenging for drivers to comply with the Federal Motor
25	Carrier Safety Administration Hours of Service (HOS) rules,
26	drivers are often faced with an untenable choice of either
27	parking in undesignated and unsafe areas or violating their
28	Hours of Service, which also creates a dilemma for law

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29	enforcement who can either force truck drivers to relocate,
30	placing them in violation of HOS rules and taking a risk
31	that the drivers may be too fatigued to drive safely, or
32	they can allow the drivers to remain parked illegally; and
33	WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Transportation has
3 4	determined that every U.S. state currently has a truck
35	parking shortage and 98 percent of truck drivers regularly
36	experience difficulties finding safe parking; and
37	WHEREAS, according to the American Transportation
38	Research Institute, drivers surveyed across the nation year
39	after year have listed truck parking among their top
40	challenges; and
41	WHEREAS, the lack of available safe parking for
42	drivers has created a chilling effect on the recruitment and
43	retention of drivers, especially female drivers, in the
4 4	trucking industry, exacerbating the significant driver
45	shortage; and
46	WHEREAS, with the passing of the Infrastructure
47	Investment & Jobs Act resources have become available to
48	state and local governments to expand truck parking
49	capacity; and
50	WHEREAS, in its 2022 Alabama Freight Plan, the
51	Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) identified
52	several highway segments where truck parking capacity is
53	inadequate; ALDOT projected that if no additional truck
54	parking capacity is added by 2025, demand will increase by
55	at least 55 percent, with some segments experiencing a
56	doubling in demand; now therefore,



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57 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 58 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we, the members of the Alabama Legislature, acknowledge professional truck drivers 59 are essential to the daily lives of Alabamians, delivering 60 61 the goods that we often take for granted, from fresh water to fuel to the physical roofs over our heads, and we 62 63 acknowledge the inadequate availability of truck parking in 64 the State of Alabama has a detrimental impact on the 65 trucking profession and overall supply chain efficiency; and 66 we will support policies that will result in the betterment of the overall quality, quantity, and availability of truck 67 parking in Alabama in order to support the main mode of 68 69 freight transportation that is essential to the lives of all 70 Alabamians; we urge ALDOT to invest available state and 71 federal resources to expand truck parking capacity at the 72 locations where the department has identified current and 73 future shortages. 74 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State 75 send duly authenticated copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Alabama, Director of the Alabama 76 77 Department of Transportation, the United States Secretary of 78 Transportation, and the Alabama Congressional Delegation.
