The Arkansas Children's Hospital President and C.E.O. may 13 14 request the Department of Human Services-Division of Medical Services to 15 retain in the Department of Human Services Grant Fund account an amount not 16 to exceed \$1,000,000 for funds made available by the act to be used to match 17 federal funds used for supplemental Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's 18 Hospital.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018

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22 SECTION 70. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 23 TRANSFER 24 PROCEDURES - MEDICAL MARIJUANA IMPLEMENTATION AND REGULATION. In the event 25 that sufficient appropriation is not provided by the General Assembly for 26 expenditures resulting from the implementation and regulation of the Arkansas 27 Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016 for any state agency, pursuant to Arkansas Code § 19-4-701 et seq., said agency shall request a transfer of 28 29 appropriation from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, stating clearly the 30 amount required. Upon approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State said 31 appropriations shall be established upon the books of the Department of 32 Finance and Administration in compliance with the applicable classifications 33 of appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code §§ 19-4-521 through 19-4-34 527.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
2019 through June 30, 2019 2020.

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2	SECTION 71. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
3	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
4	TRANSFER AUTHORITY. From time to time, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
5	may transfer from his or her books and those of the Treasurer of State and
6	the Auditor of State from the Medical Marijuana Implementation and Operations
7	Fund to various state agencies' funds the amounts necessary to fund the
8	expenses for the implementation, administration, and/or enforcement of the
9	Arkansas Medical Marijuana Amendment of 2016.

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13	SECTION 72. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

15	BOND PROGRAM. The Director of the Department of Finance and Administration

19	and Public School Employees (Appropriation 2DQ).

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23	SECTION 73. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
25	PROCEDURES - VARIOUS TEMPORARY APPROPRIATION FOR STATE AGENCIES AND
26	INSTITUTIONS. (i) In the event that sufficient appropriation is not provided
27	by the General Assembly for any state agency or institution, an agency or
28	institution may request a transfer of appropriation, as provided in the
29	Various Temporary Appropriation for State Agencies and Institutions
30	Appropriation Section of this Act, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
31	State, stating clearly the amount requested, purpose and any additional
32	information requested by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State.
33	(ii) After reviewing a request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may
34	deny, modify or approve the agencies or institutions request based on the
35	estimated amount of appropriation needed and currently available, purpose,
36	estimated funding available and preferred spending priority. Upon approval

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1	or modification of a request by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
2	after meeting the requirements of subsection (iii) or (iv) herein, the
3	Department of Finance and Administration shall establish the transfer of
4	appropriation on the books of the Department of Finance and Administration
5	and the State Auditor, in compliance with the applicable classifications of
6	appropriations as enumerated in Arkansas Code 19-4-521 through 19-4-525.
7	(iii) Any request as authorized in subsection (ii) herein in the last month
8	of a fiscal year that is equal to or less than 10% of the authorized
9	commitment item that the appropriation is requested for, shall be reported to
10	the Arkansas Legislative Council or if next meeting in Regular or Fiscal
11	Session the Joint Budget Committee at the next meeting.
12	(iv) Any request approved as authorized in subsection (ii) herein that is
13	not on the last month of a fiscal year or is greater than 10% on the last
14	month of a fiscal year as defined in subsection (iii) herein, or establishes
15	a new commitment item or new appropriation shall require prior approval by
16	the Arkansas Legislative Council or if meeting in Regular or Fiscal Session
17	the Joint Budget Committee.
18	(v) Any appropriation approved as authorized in this Section shall not be
19	carried forward to the next fiscal year and shall be identified as a change
20	level increase by the state agency or institution, if requested.
21	(vi) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation for a state agency or
22	institution each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly.
23	This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
24	appropriation act(s) for a state agency or institution. Further, the General
25	Assembly has determined that a state agency or institution may operate more
26	efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the state agency or
27	institution authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is

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SECTION 74. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 2 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 3 4 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 5 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 8 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 9 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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SECTION 75. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 12 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 13 14 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 15 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 20

SECTION 76. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 21 22 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 23 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2019 is essential to the operation of 24 25 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 26 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2019 could work irreparable harm 27 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 28 29 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act 30 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2019. 31 32 33 /s/Joint Budget Committee 34

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
