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tax exemption for durable medical equipment, mobility-enhancing equipment, prosthetic devices, and disposable medical supplies, is amended to read as follows: (a)(1) Gross receipts or gross proceeds derived from the rental, sale, or repair of durable medical equipment prescribed by a physician, mobility-enhancing equipment prescribed by a physician, a prosthetic device prescribed by a physician, and disposable medical supplies prescribed by a physician shall be exempt from all state and local sales and use taxes. (2) This exemption shall apply only to durable: (A) Durable medical equipment, mobility-enhancing equipment, a prosthetic device, and disposable medical supplies sold to a specific patient pursuant to a prescription written before the sale; and (B) A prosthetic device. SECTION 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this act are effective on the first day of the calendar quarter following the effective date of this act.
