30	(c) For the purpose of and after meeting the requirements of subsection (d)
31	herein, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may from time to time transfer
32	on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor of the
33	State funds from the Restricted Reserve Fund to one (1) or more general
34	revenue operating funds or fund accounts, the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund
35	Account, the Arkansas Department of Transportation for state matching funds
36	and the State Central Services Fund upon prior approval of the greater of

1	three-fifths (3/5) of the quorum present or a majority of the membership of
2	the Legislative Council or, if the General Assembly is in session, the Joint
3	Budget Committee.
4	(d)(1) If at any time during the Fiscal Year a State Agency, Board,
5	Commission, State Institution of Higher Education or Constitutional Officer
6	determines that it is necessary to perform its duties or is in the best
7	interest of the citizens of the State of Arkansas to request a transfer from
8	the Restricted Reserve Fund that entity shall submit a detailed request in
9	writing to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State stating:
10	(A) The need and purpose of the transfer;
11	(B) Efforts to find efficiencies and savings prior to making the request;
12	(C) Current year to date budget and expenditures by line item; and
13	(D) A detailed line item budget reflecting proposed expenditures in the
14	amount requested.
15	(2) The Chief Fiscal Officer may request additional information to make a
16	determination and may then approve, modify or deny the request.
17	(3) Upon the determination by Chief Fiscal Officer of the State that a
18	transfer is necessary, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall submit the
19	entities request and his or her recommendation for approval as required in
20	subsection (c) herein.
21	
22	SECTION 7. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
23	SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL, AND TEMPORARY LAW. (a)(1) Notwithstanding any
24	other provision of law, after making the maximum allocations as provided for
25	general revenues available for distribution as set out in Arkansas Code 19-
26	5-401 through 19-5-405 the State Treasurer shall first transfer:
27	(2) Seventy-five percent (75%) of the remaining general revenues
28	available for distribution on the last day of business in each calendar month
29	to the Restricted Reserve Fund in an amount not to exceed forty seven million
30	nine hundred seventy four thousand thirty-nine dollars (\$47,974,039), there
31	to be used for the respective purposes as provided by law; and
32	(3) Twenty-five percent (25%) of the remaining general revenues available
33	for distribution during each fiscal year on the last day of business in each
34	<u>calendar month to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund in an amount not to</u>
35	exceed fifteen million nine hundred ninety-one thousand three hundred forty-
36	<u>six dollars (\$15,991,346).</u>

1	(b)(1) Then any general revenues available for distribution over the sixty-
2	three million nine hundred sixty-five thousand three hundred eighty-five
3	dollars (\$63,965,385) as set out in Subsection (a) herein shall be
4	distributed as follows:
5	(2) Seventy-five percent (75%) of the remaining general revenues available
6	for distribution shall be transferred on the last day of business in each
7	calendar month to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund, there to be
8	used for the respective purposes as provided by law; and
9	(3) Twenty-five percent (25%) of the remaining general revenues available
10	for distribution shall be transferred on the last day of business in each
11	calendar month to the Arkansas Highway Transfer Fund.
12	(c) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2018
13	through June 30, 2019.
14	
15	SECTION 8. CODE AMENDMENT. Arkansas Code 19-5-1013 is amended to read
16	as follows:
17	19-5-1013. Merit Adjustment Fund Performance Fund.
18	(a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor
19	of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
20	<u>"Merit Adjustment Fund"</u> <u>"Performance Fund"</u> .
21	(b) The fund shall be used for transfer of funds and appropriations to
22	various state agencies, funded, in whole or in part, with general revenues,
23	for regular salary and personal services matching adjustments authorized by
24	the General Assembly and to award <del>merit</del> raises to employees based upon the
25	performance evaluation system and in accordance with rules promulgated by the
26	Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and which do not have sufficient funding or
27	appropriations to pay for the raises or increases.
28	(c) The fund shall consist of those general revenues provided by law.
29	(d) Any references to the Merit Adjustment Fund in the Arkansas Code or Acts
30	of the General Assembly, including without limitation of appropriation Acts,
31	shall be deemed and interpreted as the Performance Fund.
32	
33	SECTION 9. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
34	SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. <u>DUPLICATE ACTS. If HB1137</u>
35	and SB122 of the 2018 Fiscal Session of the 91 <sup>st</sup> General Assembly are both
36	enacted and adopted by the $91^{st}$ General Assembly in identical form, then the
