7 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 9 ALLOWANCES - RECRUITMENT. The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas 10 is hereby authorized to make available to the President of the University of 11 Arkansas special allowances in such amounts as the Board may determine to be 12 justified at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, for the use of 13 the Chancellor and his deans, representatives, department heads, and 14 directors at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in recruitment 15 of faculty and staff members. Upon approval by the President and the Board 16 of Trustees, such funds shall be administered by the Chancellor, who shall 17 assure that the total amount expended for such purposes does not exceed one 18 hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) each fiscal year or so much thereof 19 as may be authorized by the Board of Trustees. The funds authorized by this 20 Section shall come from a source other than state tax dollars appropriated by 21 the General Assembly or charges made to students for tuition, fees, room and 22 board, or other purposes. Each year the Chancellor shall furnish to the 23 President of the University of Arkansas, the Board of Trustees, and the 24 Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing Committee a report showing for each 25 expenditure the date, the amount, the names of persons to whom the 26 expenditure was made, and the purpose for which the expenditure was made.

When overtime, shift 34 differentials, standby pay, incentive pay and/or specialty differential are 35 provided to employees as herein described, the total may exceed the line item 36 maximum salaries for those positions as included in this Act. 1 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ADMISSION 3 POLICY. The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall admit one 4 hundred fifty (150) freshman students in each fiscal year into the College of 5 Medicine. These positions are to be used by the 18 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the personal 19 services needs of the University during the 2011-2012 2012-2013 fiscal year 20 exceed the number of positions in a classification allocated to the 21 University by the Legislature. The University shall provide justification to 22 OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool". No 23 classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific 24 positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and approved 25 by the Legislative Council.

SECTION 46. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 29 30 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 31 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2012 is essential to the operation of 32 33 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 34 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2012 could work irreparable harm 35 36 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
