#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING A STATE INCOME TAX DEDUCTION FOR A TAXPAYER WHO
102	IS PROHIBITED FROM CLAIMING A FEDERAL INCOME TAX
103	DEDUCTION BY SECTION 280E OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE
104	BECAUSE MARIJUANA IS A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE UNDER
105	FEDERAL LAW, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN
106	APPROPRIATION.

HOUSE Amended 2nd Reading April 2, 2013 The starting point for determining state income tax liability is federal taxable income. This number is adjusted for additions and subtractions (deductions) that are used to determine Colorado taxable income, which amount is multiplied by the state's 4.63% income tax rate.

Section 280E of the internal revenue code (section 280E) prohibits a trade or business that is illegally trafficking controlled substances from claiming any federal income tax deductions. This increases federal taxable income and, consequently, state income tax liability.

The bill allows a taxpayer who is licensed under the "Colorado Medical Marijuana Code" or under regulations promulgated by the department of revenue pursuant to amendment 64 to claim a state income tax deduction for an expenditure that is eligible to be claimed as a federal income tax deduction but is disallowed by section 280E because marijuana is a controlled substance under federal law. Taxpayers eligible for this deduction include medical marijuana centers, optional premises cultivation operations, medical marijuana-infused product manufacturers, marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana testing facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, and retail marijuana stores.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-22-104, add (4) 3 (p) as follows: 4 39-22-104. Income tax imposed on individuals, estates, and 5 trusts - single rate - definitions - repeal. (4) There shall be subtracted 6 from federal taxable income: 7 (p) FOR INCOME TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER JANUARY 8 1, 2014, IF A TAXPAYER IS LICENSED UNDER THE "COLORADO MEDICAL 9 MARIJUANA CODE", ARTICLE 43.3 OF TITLE 12, C.R.S., AN AMOUNT EQUAL 10 TO ANY EXPENDITURE THAT IS ELIGIBLE TO BE CLAIMED AS A FEDERAL 11 INCOME TAX DEDUCTION BUT IS DISALLOWED BY SECTION 280E OF THE 12 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE BECAUSE MARIJUANA IS A CONTROLLED 13 SUBSTANCE UNDER FEDERAL LAW. 14 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 39-22-304, add (3) 15 (m) as follows:

10	SECTION 3. Appropriation. In addition to any other
11	appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the
12	general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of revenue, for
13	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, the sum of \$280,000, or so much
14	thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the taxation business group
15	computer programming costs related to the implementation of this act.
16	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
17	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
18	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
19	7, 2013, if adjournment sine die is on May 8, 2013); except that, if a
20	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
21	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
22	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
23	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
24	November 2014 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
25	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
