Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the statewide membership organization grant program (grant program) for statewide membership organizations (statewide organizations) that operate as umbrella administrative organizations for smaller youth services organizations (member organizations) throughout the state. Eligible member organizations must meet all existing criteria for a Tony Grampsas youth services program, as well as several additional criteria. The statewide organizations must be comprised of eligible member organizations that collectively serve children and youth, a minimum of 60% of whom qualify for free or reduced-cost lunch, and provide services to a minimum of 25 counties, 30% of which must be considered rural.

The Tony Grampsas youth services board (board) shall review grant applications and award grants to eligible statewide organizations, based on board-determined guidelines and criteria. Grants awarded through the grant program may be of any size, and the board shall not place a cap on dollar amounts that may be awarded.

The statewide membership organization grant fund is created.

5 (2) (a) Statewide membership organization grant program 6 creation. THERE IS CREATED IN THE TONY GRAMPSAS YOUTH SERVICES

CHILDREN AND YOUTH;

(III) PROVIDE REGULAR FACILITY-BASED, AFTER-SCHOOL AND
SUMMER PROGRAMS WITH YOUTH DEVELOPMENT SERVICES AVAILABLE AT
LEAST FIFTEEN HOURS PER WEEK DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR AND THIRTY
HOURS PER WEEK DURING THE SUMMER;

(IV) OFFER REGULAR HOMEWORK ASSISTANCE, TUTORING, AND
 ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES LED BY PAID PROFESSIONAL STAFF
 AND SUPPLEMENTED BY VOLUNTEERS; AND

26 (V) PROVIDE A UNIFORM OVERALL PROGRAM STRUCTURE, AS
27 ESTABLISHED BY THE STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION.

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(c) A STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION IS ELIGIBLE TO
 RECEIVE A GRANT THROUGH THE PROGRAM IF ITS ELIGIBLE MEMBER
 ORGANIZATIONS COLLECTIVELY:

4 (I) PROVIDE SERVICES IN A MINIMUM OF TWENTY-FIVE COUNTIES,
5 WITH AT LEAST THIRTY PERCENT OF THOSE COUNTIES DEEMED RURAL
6 ACCORDING TO THE STATE DEMOGRAPHER; AND

7 (II) SERVE CHILDREN AND YOUTH, A MINIMUM OF SIXTY PERCENT
8 OF WHOM QUALIFY FOR FREE OR REDUCED-COST LUNCH UNDER THE
9 SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM.

10 **Administration.** (a) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL (3) 11 ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM. THE BOARD SHALL SELECT THE STATEWIDE 12 MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATIONS THAT WILL RECEIVE GRANTS THROUGH THE 13 PROGRAM AND THE AMOUNT OF EACH GRANT. IN ADDITION, THE STATE 14 DEPARTMENT SHALL MONITOR THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE STATEWIDE 15 MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATIONS THAT RECEIVE GRANT MONEYS. (c) All existing provisions for Tony Grampsas youth
Services programs established in sections 26-6.8-102 and

26 (d) A STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION THAT APPLIES FOR
27 A GRANT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IS INELIGIBLE TO APPLY FOR A

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1 GRANT FROM THE TONY GRAMPSAS YOUTH SERVICES PROGRAM CREATED 2 IN SECTION 26-6.8-102; THE "COLORADO YOUTH MENTORING SERVICES 3 ACT" CREATED IN SECTION 26-6.8-104; THE COLORADO STUDENT 4 DROPOUT PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION PROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 5 26-6.8-105; OR THE COLORADO STUDENT BEFORE-AND-AFTER-SCHOOL 6 PROJECT CREATED IN SECTION 26-6.8-106. ELIGIBLE MEMBER 7 ORGANIZATIONS, HOWEVER, REMAIN ELIGIBLE TO APPLY TO ANY OF THE 8 GRANT PROGRAMS IN THIS ARTICLE 6.8 FOR WHICH THEY OTHERWISE MEET 9 ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA.

10 (4) Statewide membership organization grant fund - creation. 11 THERE IS CREATED IN THE STATE TREASURY THE STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP 12 ORGANIZATION GRANT FUND CONSISTING OF MONEYS THAT THE GENERAL 13 ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE TO THE FUND, PURSUANT TO SECTION 14 26-6.8-102 (2) (d) (IV). THE MONEYS IN THE FUND ARE SUBJECT TO 15 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO THE STATE 16 DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING GRANTS TO STATEWIDE 17 MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATIONS AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION AND THE 18 DIRECT AND INDIRECT COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF 19 THIS SECTION. 13	- duties. (2) (b) In addition to the guidelines developed pursuant to
14	paragraph (a) of this subsection (2), the board shall develop criteria for
15	awarding grants under the Tony Grampsas youth services program AND
16	THE STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION GRANT PROGRAM, including
17	but not limited to the following requirements:
18	(c) In addition to the guidelines and criteria developed pursuant
19	to paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection (2), the board shall develop
20	result-oriented criteria for measuring the effectiveness of programs that
21	receive grants under the Tony Grampsas youth services program AND THE
22	STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION GRANT PROGRAM as deemed
23	appropriate to the nature of each program including, but not limited to,
24	requiring grantees to evaluate the impact of the services provided by the
25	program. Any criteria developed pursuant to this paragraph (c) for
26	measuring the effectiveness of student dropout prevention and
27	intervention programs established pursuant to section 26-6.8-105 shall

MUST include the implementation of a method by which to track the
 students served by the program to evaluate the impact of the services
 provided, which tracking shall continue, if possible, for at least two years
 or through graduation from a secondary school, whichever occurs first.

5 (3) In addition to the guidelines and criteria developed pursuant 6 to subsection (2) of this section, the board shall establish timelines for 7 submission and review of applications for grants through the Tony 8 Grampsas youth services program AND THE STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP 9 ORGANIZATION GRANT PROGRAM. The board shall also adopt timelines for 10 submission to the governor of the list of entities chosen to receive grants. 11 If the governor disapproves the list, the board may submit a replacement 12 list within thirty days after such disapproval.

(4) The board shall review all applications received pursuant to
section 26-6.8-102 for grants from the Tony Grampsas youth services
program AND SECTION 26-6.8-107 FOR GRANTS FROM THE STATEWIDE
MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION GRANT PROGRAM and choose those entities
that shall WILL receive grants through the Tony Grampsas youth services
program and the amount of each grant.

(5) In addition to the duties relating specifically to the Tony
Grampsas youth services program specified in this section, the board shall
operate the prevention, intervention, and treatment programs specified in
this article, INCLUDING THE STATEWIDE MEMBERSHIP ORGANIZATION
GRANT PROGRAM and such other prevention, intervention, and treatment
programs as may be assigned to the board by executive order to be funded
solely by federal funds.

26 **SECTION 4.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 27 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

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ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly 1 2 (August 5, 2015, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2015); except that, 3 if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of 4 the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 5 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 6 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 7 8 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
