101 MEMORIALIZING FORMER REPRESENTATIVE LEO L. LUCERO.

1 WHEREAS, Our respected former colleague, Leo L. Lucero, a
2 past member of the Colorado General Assembly, departed this life on
3 September 24, 2019; and

4 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was born September 18, 1928,
5 in Boone, Colorado, to John and Venita Lucero; and

6 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero graduated from Centennial
7 High School in Pueblo, Colorado; and

8 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero served our nation as a
9 Sergeant in the Marine Corps; and

10 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was a teacher and school
11 administrator for Pueblo School District 60 for many years; and

12 WHEREAS, In 1970, Representative Lucero ran for and was
13 elected to the Colorado House of Representatives for House District 36;

1 WHEREAS, In 1972, Representative Lucero ran for reelection and
2 became the representative for House District 42, which he served until
3 1984; and

4 WHEREAS, During his 14 years serving as a member of the
5 House of Representatives, Representative Lucero served on the
6 Agriculture and Livestock; Labor and Employment Relations; Game,
7 Fish, and Parks; and the Legislative Audit Committees and as Chair of the
8 Education Committee; and

9 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was preceded in death by his
10 son Larry and is survived by his wife Eleanor, daughters Cindy and Judy,
11 son Gerald, and many grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and
12 great-great-grandchildren; and

13 WHEREAS, Representative Lucero was a devoted public servant
14 who will be remembered for his hard work, dedication, and
15 accomplishments; now, therefore,

16 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the*
17 *Seventy-second General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

18 That, in the death of Leo L. Lucero, the people of the State of
19 Colorado have lost a dedicated public servant and outstanding citizen, and
20 that we, the members of the Colorado House of Representatives, do
21 hereby extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of his
22 family and pay tribute to a man who served his state well and faithfully.
