AN ACT EXPANDING ELIGIBILITY IN THE CARE4KIDS PROGRAM TO PARENTS PARTICIPATING IN AN EVEN START PROGRAM OR ENROLLED IN CERTAIN SECONDARY EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (a) of section 17b-749 of the 2020 supplement to
- 2 the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
- 3 thereof (*Effective July 1, 2020*):
- 4 (a) The Commissioner of Early Childhood shall establish and operate
- 5 a child care subsidy program to increase the availability, affordability
- 6 and quality of child care services for families with a parent or caretaker
- 7 who (1) is (A) working, [or] (B) attending high school, (C) participating
- 8 in a local Even Start program, or (D) enrolled in (i) an advanced
- 9 manufacturing certificate program, (ii) an educator preparation
- 10 program approved by the State Board of Education or the appropriate
- 11 governing body in the state in which the institution of higher education
- is located, (iii) an alternate route to certification program approved by
- 13 the State Board of Education, Office of Higher Education or the
- 14 appropriate governing body in the state in which the alternate route to

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15 certification program is located, (iv) an associate degree or bachelor's 16 degree program with a concentration in early childhood education, as 17 defined in section 10-16p, or (v) a nursing program offered at a public or independent institution of higher education in the state; or (2) 18 19 receives cash assistance under the temporary family assistance program 20 from the Department of Social Services and is participating in an 21 education, training or other job preparation activity approved pursuant 22 to subsection (b) of section 17b-688i or subsection (b) of section 17b-23 689d. Services available under the child care subsidy program shall 24 include the provision of child care subsidies for children under the age 25 of thirteen or children under the age of nineteen with special needs. The 26 Office of Early Childhood shall open and maintain enrollment for the 27 child care subsidy program and shall administer such program within 28 the existing budgetary resources available. The office shall issue a notice 29 on the office's Internet web site any time the office closes the program to 30 new applications, changes eligibility requirements, changes program 31 benefits or makes any other change to the program's status or terms, 32 except the office shall not be required to issue such notice when the 33 office expands program eligibility. Any change in the office's acceptance 34 of new applications, eligibility requirements, program benefits or any 35 other change to the program's status or terms for which the office is 36 required to give notice pursuant to this subsection, shall not be effective 37 until thirty days after the office issues such notice.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
