## AN ACT CONCERNING THE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER AND QUEER HEALTH, HUMAN SERVICES AND OPPORTUNITY NETWORK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. Section 19a-132 of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1*, 2022):
- 3 (a) There is established a Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and
- 4 Queer Health, [and] Human Services and Opportunity Network to
- 5 make recommendations to the state legislative, executive and judicial
- 6 branches of government concerning (1) the <u>promotion of equitable</u>
- 7 <u>access to opportunities for, (2) the</u> delivery of health and human services
- 8 to, and (3) educational awareness about lesbian, gay, bisexual,
- 9 transgender and queer persons in the state.

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- 10 (b) The network shall work to build a safer and healthier environment
- 11 for [gay, lesbian,] <u>lesbian, gay,</u> bisexual, transgender and queer persons
- 12 by (1) conducting a needs analysis, within available appropriations, (2)
- 13 collecting additional data on the health and human services needs of
- such persons as necessary, (3) informing state policy through reports
- 15 submitted at least biennially, in accordance with the provisions of
- section 11-4a, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly
- 17 having cognizance of matters relating to public health, human services,

- 18 appropriations and the budgets of state agencies, other legislative
- 19 committees as necessary, the Governor and the Chief Court
- 20 Administrator, and (4) building organizational member capacity,
- 21 leadership and advocacy across the geographic and social spectrum of
- 22 the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer community.
- 23 (c) The network shall include, but need not be limited to, the
- 24 following members, or their designees:

- 67 lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer community;
- (D) A representative of the African American/Black lesbian, gay,
- 69 bisexual, transgender and queer community;
- 70 (E) A representative of the LGBTQ+ women community;

91	the Governor; and

93	(d) [Members shall serve at the will of the speaker of the House of		
94	Representatives and the president pro tempore of the Senate, who may		
95	each appoint additional members and set term limits for each member.]		
96	Appointments to the network [shall be made not later than sixty days		
97	after the effective date of this section] <u>pursuant to subdivisions (12) and</u>		

- 98 (13) of subsection (c) of this section shall be made not later than
- 99 <u>September 1, 2022</u>. Members <u>of the network</u> shall choose chairpersons.
- Any vacancy <u>under subdivisions (12) and (13) of subsection (c) of this</u>
- 101 <u>section</u> shall be filled by the [speaker of the House of Representatives,
- acting in consultation with the president pro tempore of the Senate]
- appointing authority. Vacancies under subdivisions (1) to (11),
- inclusive, of subsection (c) of this section shall be filled by a majority
- vote of members of the network.
- (e) The administrative staff of the Commission on Women, Children, 106 107 Seniors, Equity and Opportunity shall provide administrative support to the network. The executive director of the commission shall 108 109 administer network funds through a fiscal agent, with the advice and 110 consent of the network. The network may use such funds as may be available from federal, state or other sources and may enter into 111 contracts to carry out the purposes of the network, including, but not 112 113 limited to, contracts for additional administrative support, programmatic initiatives and grantmaking. The network may also 114 115 utilize voluntary and uncompensated services of private individuals, 116 state or federal agencies and organizations as may, from time to time, be 117 offered and needed.
