AN ACT CONCERNING THE COMMUNICATION NEEDS OF PERSONS WHO ARE DEAF, HARD OF HEARING, OR DEAF-BLIND IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That the general statutes be amended to require: (1) Law
- 2 enforcement agencies to send text message alerts to persons who are
- deaf, hard of hearing or deaf-blind in schools; (2) visual lighting
- 4 signals, video messaging and auditory alarms to relay information; (3)
- 5 establishment of a method to allow persons who are deaf, hard of
- 6 hearing, or deaf-blind who are sheltering during an emergency to be
- 7 able to inform emergency responders of their location; and (4)
- 8 emergency responders to receive basic American Sign Language
- 9 training to allow them to communicate directions such as "hide",
- 10 "quiet", "get down" and "run" in an emergency.

Statement of Purpose:

To address the communication needs of persons who are deaf, hard of hearing or deaf-blind in emergency situations.
