Substitute Bill No. 7111

AN ACT CONCERNING REVISIONS TO THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION CURRICULUM AND THE AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION ON THE DANGERS OF VAPING FOR USE BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) Not later than January 1, 2020, the
2 Department of Education shall include the role of consent in sexual
3 relationships in the comprehensive school health education component
4 of the Healthy and Balanced Living Curriculum Framework developed
5 by the department in 2006.

6 Sec. 2. Subsection (d) of section 10-16b of the general statutes is
7 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
8 *1, 2019*):

9 (d) The State Board of Education shall make available curriculum
10 materials and such other materials as may assist local and regional
11 boards of education in developing instructional programs pursuant to
12 this section. The State Board of Education, within available
13 appropriations and utilizing available resource materials, shall assist
14 and encourage local and regional boards of education to include: (1)
15 Holocaust and genocide education and awareness; (2) the historical
16 events surrounding the Great Famine in Ireland; (3) African-American
17 history; (4) Puerto Rican history; (5) Native American history; (6)

18 personal financial management, including, but not limited to, financial
19 literacy as developed in the plan provided under section 10-16pp; (7)
20 training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of automatic
21 external defibrillators; (8) labor history and law, including organized
22 labor, the collective bargaining process, existing legal protections in the
23 workplace, the history and economics of free market capitalism and
24 entrepreneurialism, and the role of labor and capitalism in the
25 development of the American and world economies; (9) climate
26 change consistent with the Next Generation Science Standards; (10)
27 topics approved by the state board upon the request of local or
28 regional boards of education as part of the program of instruction
29 offered pursuant to subsection (a) of this section; [and] (11) instruction
30 relating to the Safe Haven Act, sections 17a-57 to 17a-61, inclusive; and
31 (12) instruction relating to the dangers and health consequences of
32 using electronic nicotine delivery systems and vapor products. The
33 Department of Energy and Environmental Protection shall be available
34 to each local and regional board of education for the development of
35 curriculum on climate change as described in this subsection.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
