AN ACT ESTABLISHING FINISH LINE GRANTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2019*) (a) For the purposes of this section:
- 3 (1) "Award" means (A) the unpaid portion, if any, of a qualifying 4 student's eligible institutional costs after subtracting his or her 5 financial aid, or (B) five hundred dollars, whichever is greater;
- 6 (2) "Eligible institutional costs" means the tuition and required fees 7 for an individual student that are published by each public institution 8 of higher education;
- 9 (3) "Financial aid" means the sum of all scholarships, grants and 10 federal, state and institutional aid received by a qualifying student. 11 "Financial aid" does not include any federal, state or private student 12 loans received by a qualifying student;
 - (4) "Qualifying student" means any person who (A) is a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at a public institution of higher education, (B) is classified as an in-state student pursuant to section 10a-29 of the general statutes, (C) possesses an undergraduate college cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 and has earned half of the credit hours required for completion of an associate or bachelor's

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- 19 degree, (D) has completed the Free Application for Federal Student
- 20 Aid or an institutionally accepted financial aid application, (E) has an
- 21 expected family contribution for educational costs, as computed from
- 22 the student's Free Application for Federal Student Aid or
- 23 institutionally accepted financial aid application, of seven thousand
- 24 five hundred dollars or less, and (F) has accepted all available financial
- 25 aid;
- 26 (5) "Full-time undergraduate student" means a student who is
- 27 enrolled at a public institution of higher education in a course of study
- 28 leading to an associate or bachelor's degree and who is carrying (A)
- 29 twelve or more semester credit hours in a semester, or (B) thirty or
- 30 more semester credit hours in an academic year; and
- 31 (6) "Public institution of higher education" means the constituent
- 32 units of the state system of higher education identified in subdivisions
- 33 (1) and (2) of section 10a-1 of the general statutes.
- 34 (b) Before the start of the fall semester of 2020, the state, acting
- 35 through the Office of Higher Education, shall establish the Finish Line
- 36 Grant program to annually make awards to qualifying students for
- 37 eligible institutional costs. An award shall be available to a qualifying
- 38 student when the qualifying student has earned half of the credit hours
- 39 required for completion of the qualifying student's first associate or
- 40 bachelor's degree program, provided the qualifying student meets and
- 41 continues to meet the requirements of this section.
- 42 (c) Before the start of the fall semester of 2020, and each semester
- 43 thereafter, each public institution of higher education shall conduct a
- 44 financial and academic audit to determine the number of qualifying
- students enrolled at the institution and the amount of the award to be
- 46 made to each qualifying student under this section. A public
- institution of higher education shall not use an award to supplant any
- 48 state or institutional aid otherwise available to a qualifying student.
- The amount of the annual appropriation to be allocated to each public
- 50 institution of higher education shall be the sum of all awards made to

51 qualifying students enrolled at the public institution of higher 52 education during each semester of the prior academic year. If the sum 53 of all awards made to qualifying students exceeds the amount of the 54 annual appropriation for the Finish Line Grant program in any year, 55 the Office of Higher Education shall prioritize allocations in 56 accordance with criteria developed by the office. Not later than 57 September first and February first, annually, each public institution of 58 higher education shall report the sum of all awards made to qualifying 59 students and the results from the financial and academic audit conducted each semester to the Office of Higher Education. Each 60 61 public institution of higher education shall expend all of the moneys 62 received under the Finish Line Grant program as direct financial 63 assistance only for eligible institutional costs.

- (d) Any qualifying student receiving an award under this section shall participate in a volunteer-based mentorship and counseling program, as prescribed by the Office of Higher Education.
- (e) Not later than January 1, 2021, and annually thereafter, the Office of Higher Education shall report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to higher education and employment advancement and appropriations on the Finish Line Grant program.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
