AN ACT CONCERNING THE PRACTICE OF DENTAL THERAPY BY LICENSED DENTAL HYGIENISTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (Effective October 1, 2019) (a) As used in this 2 section:
- 3 (1) "General supervision of a licensed dentist" has the same meaning as provided in section 20-126*l* of the general statutes;
- 5 (2) "Public health facility" has the same meaning as provided in section 20-126*l* of the general statutes;
- 7 (3) The "practice of dental therapy" means the performance of
- 8 educational, preventive and therapeutic services including: (A)
- 9 Identification of oral and systemic conditions requiring evaluation or
- 10 treatment by dentists, physicians or other healthcare providers and
- 11 referrals to such healthcare providers; (B) diagnosis and treatment of
- 12 oral diseases and conditions within the dental therapist scope of
- practice; (C) comprehensive charting of the oral cavity; (D) oral health
- 14 instruction and disease prevention education, including nutritional

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(E) counseling and dietary analysis; dispension administration or topical application of nonnarcotic analgesics, antiinflammatory and antibiotic medications as prescribed by a licensed health care provider, with the exception of schedule II, III or IV controlled substances; (F) application of topical preventive or prophylactic agents, including fluoride, fluoride varnish, antimicrobial agents and pit and fissure sealants; (G) pulp vitality testing; (H) application of desensitizing medication or resin; (I) interim therapeutic restorations; (J) fabrication of athletic mouth guards; (K) periodontal dressing changes; (L) administration of local anesthetic pursuant to subsection (d) of section 20-126l of the general statutes; (M) simple extraction of erupted primary teeth; (N) nonsurgical extraction of periodontally diseased permanent teeth with grade three or higher tooth mobility, with the exception of an extraction when a tooth is unerupted, impacted, fractured or needs to be sectioned for removal; (O) emergency palliative treatment of dental pain, limited to the procedures listed in this subdivision; (P) preparation and placement of direct restoration in primary and permanent teeth, that does not require the fabrication of crowns, bridges, veneers or dentures; (Q) fabrication and placement of single-tooth temporary crowns; (R) administration of nitrous oxide; (S) preparation and placement of preformed crowns on primary teeth; (T) indirect and direct pulp capping on permanent teeth; (U) indirect pulp capping on primary teeth; (V) suture removal; (W) minor adjustments and repairs on removable prostheses; (X) placement and removal of space maintainers; and (Y) recementing permanent crowns.

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(b) No person shall engage in the practice of dental therapy unless such person (1) is a dental hygienist licensed under chapter 379a of the general statutes, (2) has a certificate of graduation from a dental therapy program (A) accredited for dental therapy by the Commission on Dental Accreditation, or such other national professional accrediting body as may be recognized by the Department of Public Health, and (B) offered by an institution of higher education, and (3) practices in a public health facility under the general supervision of a

- 53 (c) A collaborative agreement between a dentist and a dental 54 hygienist engaging in the practice of dental therapy may allow such 55 dental hygienist to directly supervise not more than two dental 56 assistants, expanded function dental assistants or dental hygienists. 57 Nothing in this section shall require a dentist to enter into a
- 57 Nothing in this section shall require a dentist to enter into a collaborative agreement with a dental hygienist.
- (d) Each certified dental hygienist engaging in the practice of dental therapy and applying for a renewal of such certification shall earn a minimum of six hours of continuing education within the preceding certification period related to the practice of dental therapy in addition to satisfying the continuing education requirements of section 20-1261 of the general statutes.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following

Statement of Purpose:

To allow dental hygienists to become certified in dental therapy and engage in the practice of dental therapy for the purpose of increasing access to dental care.
