## AN ACT CONCERNING THE ACCESSIBILITY OF PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective July 1, 2019*) The Department of Public Health, in
- 2 collaboration with the Department of Consumer Protection, shall study
- the public health impact of a person not taking medication prescribed
- 4 to such person by his or her health care provider, or not taking such
- 5 medication as directed, because he or she cannot afford to pay for such
- 6 medication. Such study shall include, but not be limited to, strategies
- 7 to improve patient access to medication prescribed by the patient's
- 8 health care provider. On or before January 1, 2020, the Commissioners
- 9 of Public Health and Consumer Protection shall report, in accordance
- with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint
- 11 standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of
- 12 matters relating to public health and consumer protection regarding
- 13 the findings of such study.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
