AN ACT ESTABLISHING A WORKFORCE PIPELINE AND JOB CREATION TASK FORCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a workforce
- 2 pipeline and job creation task force to prepare the state's future
- 3 workforce for well-paying manufacturing and technical jobs located in
- 4 Connecticut.
- 5 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:
- 6 (1) Two appointed by the speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 7 (2) Two appointed by the president pro tempore of the Senate;
- 8 (3) One appointed by the majority leader of the House of
- 9 Representatives;
- 10 (4) One appointed by the majority leader of the Senate;
- 11 (5) One appointed by the minority leader of the House of

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- 12 Representatives;
- 13 (6) One appointed by the minority leader of the Senate;
- 14 (7) The Labor Commissioner, or the commissioner's designee; and
- 15 (8) Two persons appointed by the Governor.
- 16 (c) Any member of the task force appointed under subdivision (1),
- 17 (2), (3), (4), (5) or (6) of subsection (b) of this section may be a member
- 18 of the General Assembly.
- 19 (d) All appointments to the task force shall be made not later than
- 20 thirty days after the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall be
- 21 filled by the appointing authority.
- 22 (e) The speaker of the House of Representatives and the president
- 23 pro tempore of the Senate shall select the chairpersons of the task force
- 24 from among the members of the task force. Such chairpersons shall
- 25 schedule the first meeting of the task force, which shall be held not
- 26 later than sixty days after the effective date of this section.
- 27 (f) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the
- 28 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to the
- 29 Department of Consumer Protection shall serve as administrative staff
- 30 of the task force.
- 31 (g) Not later than January 1, 2020, the task force shall submit a
- 32 report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing
- 33 committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters
- relating to labor, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of
- 35 the general statutes. The task force shall terminate on the date that it
- 36 submits such report or January 1, 2020, whichever is later.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
