## AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF MAN-MADE STRUCTURES TO MARK THE COASTAL JURISDICTION LINE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. Subsection (d) of section 22a-359 of the general statutes is
- 2 repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October*
- 3 1, 2024):
- 4 (d) (1) For any tidal, coastal or navigable waters of the state located
- 5 upstream of a tide gate, weir, or other device that modifies the flow of
- 6 tidal waters, the coastal jurisdiction line for such tidal, coastal or
- 7 navigable waters shall be the elevation of mean high water as found at
- 8 the downstream location of such device.
- 9 (2) For any tidal, coastal or navigable waters of the state located
- 10 upstream of a pipe, culvert or similar man-made structure, the coastal
- 11 jurisdiction line for such tidal, coastal or navigable waters shall be the
- 12 elevation of mean high water as found at the downstream location of
- 13 such pipe, culvert or man-made structure.
