AN ACT CONCERNING A STUDY OF COMBINING ENERGY STORAGE SYSTEM DEPLOYMENT WITH NEW RESIDENTIAL SOLAR INSTALLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) The chairperson of the Public
2 Utilities Regulatory Authority shall conduct a study concerning the
3 combined installation of residential energy storage systems and new
4 residential solar photovoltaic systems. Such study shall include, but
5 need not be limited to, an examination of: (1) The benefits of increasing
6 the number of energy storage systems located on the customer side of
7 the revenue meter that can store energy generated by a residential
8 customer's solar photovoltaic system; (2) how the state's existing
9 renewable energy and energy storage programs, or a new program,
10 could be used to encourage the combined installation of residential
11 energy storage systems and solar photovoltaic systems; and (3)
12 opportunities to use federal funding to encourage combined installation
13 of residential energy storage systems and solar photovoltaic systems.
14 Not later than January 1, 2025, the chairperson shall report, in
15 accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes,

16 the results of such study to the joint standing committee of the General
17 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to energy and
18 technology.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
