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AN ACT CONCERNING THE DISTRIBUTION OF SINGLE-USE PLASTIC STRAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective January 1, 2021*) (a) For purposes of this section:
- 3 (1) "Consumer" means any person who is a business invitee of a full service restaurant;
 - (2) "Single-use plastic straw" means a single-use, disposable tube made predominantly of plastic derived from either petroleum or a
- 7 biologically based polymer, such as corn or other plant sources, used to
- 8 transfer a beverage from a container to the mouth of the person drinking
- 9 the beverage. "Single-use plastic straw" does not include a straw made
- 10 from nonplastic materials, including, but not limited to, paper, pasta,
- 11 sugar cane, wood, metal or bamboo.
- 12 (3) "Full-service restaurant" means any establishment with the 13 primary business purpose of serving food, where food may be
- 14 consumed on the premises, and where all of the following actions are

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- taken by an employee of the establishment:
- 16 (A) The consumer is escorted or assigned to an assigned eating area.
- 17 The employee may choose the assigned eating area or may seat the
- 18 consumer according to the consumer's need for accommodation or other
- 19 request;

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- 20 (B) The consumer's food and beverage orders are taken after the consumer is seated at the assigned seating area;
- 22 (C) The food and beverage orders are delivered directly to the 23 consumer;
- 24 (D) Any requested items associated with the consumer's food or 25 beverage order are brought to the consumer; and
- (E) The check for payment of such food or beverage order is delivereddirectly to the consumer at the assigned eating area.
 - (b) No owner or operator of a full-service restaurant shall provide a single-use plastic straw to a consumer unless requested by the consumer, except such owner or operator may provide a single-use plastic straw to any person with a disability. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require any such owner or operator who does not otherwise provide single-use plastic straws to consumers to provide consumers with such straws.
 - (c) The provisions of this section may be enforced by any municipal health department or district department of health that has jurisdiction over the subject full-service restaurant. The owner or operator of a full-service restaurant that violates the provisions of this section shall be issued a warning for the first and second violations of the provisions of this section. Any such owner or operator who violates the provisions of this section on a third or subsequent occasion shall be fined twenty-five dollars for each day such full-service restaurant is in violation provided such fines shall not exceed three hundred dollars in any year.

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(d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent any municipality from adopting and implementing an ordinance or rule that would further restrict an owner or operator of a full-service restaurant from providing a single-use plastic straw to a consumer, provided no such ordinance or rule shall prohibit any such owner or operator from providing a single-use plastic straw to a person with a disability.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following

Statement of Purpose:

To curtail the automatic distribution of single-use plastic straws in the state at certain locations.
