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AN ACT CONCERNING APPRENTICESHIP PATHWAYS TO EARNING A BACHELOR'S DEGREE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (Effective July 1, 2019) (a) The Labor Department and the

2 Board of Regents for Higher Education shall jointly create a plan for

3 the establishment of nontraditional pathway to earning a bachelor's

4 degree at the state universities and Charter Oak State College through

5 the inclusion of credits earned through apprenticeships. The plan shall

6 include, but need not be limited to, (1) the subject areas in which a

7 student may earn a bachelor's degree through a nontraditional

pathway, with a greater priority given to subject areas that have a low

completion rate and in which there is a hiring need by employers in

10 the state, (2) the form and manner in which apprenticeships may be

11 registered with the department and the board for inclusion in a

12 nontraditional pathway to earning a bachelor's degree, including

13 through public-private partnerships or an application process, (3) the

14 minimum requirements that apprenticeships in each subject area shall

15 meet to be registered as an apprenticeship with the department and

16 the board, (4) the form and manner in which a student may apply to

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17 participate in a registered apprenticeship, (5) the number of credits a 18 student may earn through a registered apprenticeship in each subject 19 area, and (6) the requirements for successful completion of a registered 20 apprenticeship in each subject area, including, but not limited to, the 21 minimum number of hours of work and the level of demonstrated 22 proficiency required in the subject area. As used in this subsection, 23 "apprenticeship" means an arrangement with an employer for any 24 person to work at and learn a profession or trade for a specified period 25 of time.

(b) Not later than January 1, 2020, the Labor Department and the Board of Regents for Higher Education shall jointly report, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, to the joint standing committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to labor and higher education and employment advancement, on the plan created pursuant to subsection (a) of this section and the timeline in which such plan may be implemented.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

Statement of Purpose:

To require the Labor Department and the Board of Regents for Higher Education to jointly establish nontraditional pathways to earning a bachelor's degree through apprenticeships.
