Substitute Bill No. 863

AN ACT CONCERNING EMPLOYMENT PROTECTION FOR MEMBERS OF THE CIVIL AIR PATROL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective October 1, 2019*) (a) As used in this 2 section:

3 (1) "Civil air patrol" means the civilian auxiliary of the United States4 Air Force;

5 (2) "Employee" means an individual who receives wages or 6 remuneration for providing services to an employer; and

7 (3) "Employer" means a person that provides wages or 8 remuneration to one or more individuals who perform services for the 9 employer under an express or implied contract of hire, including the 10 state and any political subdivision of the state.

11 (b) Subject to the provisions of subsection (c) of this section, an 12 employer shall not discriminate against, discipline, or discharge an 13 employee because: (1) The employee is a member of the civil air patrol; 14 or (2) the employee is absent from work for the purpose of (A) responding as a member of the civil air patrol to an emergency 15 16 declared by the Governor of this state or the President of the United 17 States, (B) responding as a member of the civil air patrol to a request 18 for assistance in an emergency, natural disaster or life-threatening event at the request of the United States Air Force or Coast Guard, the
Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, the Division
of Emergency Management and Homeland Security within the
Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, the state
police or a local police department in this state, or (C) participating as a
member of the civil air patrol in required emergency services training
programs and exercises.

26 (c) In the case where the employee is absent from work for a 27 purpose set forth in subdivision (2) of subsection (b) of this section, 28 such employee shall (1) give his or her employer as much notice as 29 possible of the dates such employee will be absent for any purpose set 30 forth in subparagraph (A), (B) or (C) of subdivision (2) of subsection 31 (b) of this section, and (2) provide his or her employer with written 32 verification from the civil air patrol of the purpose of the employee's 33 absence, as set forth in subparagraph (A), (B) or (C) of subdivision (2) 34 of subsection (b) of this section.

(d) Nothing in subsections (a) to (c), inclusive, of this section shall be
construed to prohibit an employer from (1) treating the time the
employee is absent because of civil air patrol service for any purpose
set forth in subdivision (2) of subsection (b) of this section as unpaid
time off, or (2) complying with a collective bargaining agreement or
employee benefit plan entered into before October 1, 2019.

(e) An employee who is a member of the civil air patrol and is trained and qualified to provide emergency services shall notify his or her employer (1) by October 31, 2019, (2) by such employee's date of employment with the employer, or (3) by the date on which such employee joins the civil air patrol, whichever is latest, that such employee may be called to participate in training or to serve in an emergency, natural disaster or life-threatening event.

(f) Any employee aggrieved by a violation of subsection (b) of this
section may bring an action in the Superior Court to recover damages
and equitable relief.

51 Sec. 2. Section 5-249 of the general statutes is repealed and the 52 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October 1, 2019*):

53 (a) (1) Any state employee who is an active volunteer firefighter or 54 member of a volunteer ambulance service or company [(1)] (A) may, 55 with the authorization of such employee's appointing authority, be 56 permitted to leave work in order to respond to fire calls or ambulance 57 calls during such employee's regular hours of employment without 58 loss of pay, vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime accumulation, 59 or [(2)] (B) shall be permitted to respond to such calls prior to reporting 60 for work without such prior authorization and without loss of pay, 61 vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime accumulation, provided in 62 either case, if requested by such employee's appointing authority, such 63 employee submits a written statement from the chief of the volunteer 64 fire department or the medical director or chief administrator of the 65 volunteer ambulance service or company verifying that such employee 66 responded to a fire or ambulance call and specifying the date, time and 67 duration of such response.

68 (2) Any state employee who is an active member of the civil air 69 patrol, as defined in section 1 of this act, (A) may, with the 70 authorization of such employee's appointing authority, be permitted to 71 leave work in order to respond to an emergency, natural disaster or life-threatening event during such employee's regular hours of 72 73 employment without loss of pay, vacation time, sick leave or earned 74 overtime accumulation, or (B) shall be permitted to respond to such 75 emergency, natural disaster or life- threatening event prior to reporting 76 for work without such prior authorization and without loss of pay, 77 vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime accumulation, provided in 78 either case, if requested by such employee's appointing authority, such 79 employee submits a written statement from the civil air patrol 80 verifying that such employee responded to an emergency, natural disaster or life-threatening event and specifying the date, time and 81 82 duration of such response.

^{83 (}b) Any state employee who is a certified disaster service volunteer

of the American Red Cross may, with the authorization of such employee's supervisor, be granted a leave not to exceed fifteen working days in each year to participate in specialized disaster relief services for the American Red Cross, upon the request of the American Red Cross, without loss of pay, vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime accumulation.

90 (c) (1) Any state employee who is an active volunteer firefighter or 91 member of a volunteer ambulance service or company may, with the 92 authorization of such employee's appointing authority, be allowed to 93 attend training sessions or drills during such employee's regular hours 94 of employment without loss of pay, overtime accumulation or sick 95 leave.

96 (2) Any state employee who is an active member of the civil air 97 patrol may, with the authorization of such employee's appointing 98 authority, be allowed to attend required emergency services training 99 programs and exercises during such employee's regular hours of 100 employment without loss of pay, overtime accumulation or sick leave.

101 (d) Any state employee who is an active member of a volunteer 102 canine search and rescue team (1) may, with the authorization of such 103 employee's supervisor, be permitted to leave work in order to respond 104 to search or rescue calls during such employee's regular hours of 105 employment without loss of pay, vacation time, sick leave or earned 106 overtime accumulation, or (2) shall be permitted to respond to such 107 calls prior to reporting for work without such prior authorization and 108 without loss of pay, vacation time, sick leave or earned overtime 109 accumulation, provided in either case, if requested by such employee's 110 supervisor, such employee submits a written statement from the chief 111 of the police or fire department verifying that such employee 112 responded to a search or rescue call and specifying the date, time and 113 duration of such response. As used in this subsection, "volunteer 114 canine search and rescue team" means an individual and a dog (A) 115 appropriately trained and certified to engage in search and rescue 116 operations by a nonprofit canine search and rescue organization that is

a member of the National Association of Search and Rescue, or its
successor organization, and (B) who jointly engage in such operations
at the request of a police or fire department and provide services
without compensation.

121 (e) (1) Any state employee who is an active volunteer firefighter and 122 is injured on or after January 1, 2014, while serving in his or her 123 capacity as a volunteer firefighter, shall be permitted to collect sick 124 leave with pay for such injury pursuant to section 5-247, provided [(1)] 125 (A) such employee is eligible to receive such sick leave pay pursuant to 126 the provisions of said section, [(2)] (B) if requested by such employee's appointing authority, such employee submits a written statement from 127 128 the chief of the volunteer fire department that such employee was 129 injured during a fire call and specifying the date, time and nature of 130 such injury, and [(3)] (C) the amount of weekly sick leave pay received 131 for such injury plus any weekly workers' compensation wage 132 replacement benefits received pursuant to section 7-314a or 7-314b for 133 such injury shall not exceed the weekly workers' compensation wage 134 replacement benefits such employee would have received had such 135 employee been injured in the course of his or her employment as a 136 state employee. A state employee's collection of sick leave pursuant to 137 this subsection shall not affect the seniority or accrual of pension 138 benefits of such state employee. The provisions of this subsection shall 139 not be construed to preempt or override the terms of any collective 140 bargaining agreement effective prior to July 1, 2015.

141 (2) Any state employee who is an active member of the civil air 142 patrol and is injured on or after October 1, 2019, while serving in his or her capacity as a member of the civil air patrol, shall be permitted to 143 144 collect sick leave with pay for such injury pursuant to section 5-247, 145 provided (A) such employee is eligible to receive such sick leave pay 146 pursuant to the provisions of said section, and (B) if requested by such employee's appointing authority, such employee submits a written 147 148 statement from the civil air patrol that such employee was injured 149 during an emergency, natural disaster or life-threatening event and

150 <u>specifying the date, time and nature of such injury.</u>
