A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend section 16-1000 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to exempt from businesses required to obtain a secondhand dealer license businesses that sell secondhand puzzles or non-electronic games or game pieces, and businesses that sell bicycles in order to recover repair and related expenses when a customer fails to pay such expenses within a designated time frame.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Secondhand Property Sales Regulation Amendment Act of 2016".

- Sec. 2. Section 1000.6 of Title 16 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (16 DCMR § 1000.6) is amended as follows:
- (a) Paragraph (h) is amended by striking the phrase "; or" and inserting a semicolon in its place.
- (b) Paragraph (i) is amended by striking the period and inserting a semicolon in its place.
 - (c) New paragraphs (j) and (k) are added to read as follows:
 - "(j) Puzzles, or non-electronic games or game pieces; or

- "(k) Bicycles that are sold for the purpose of recovering repair and related expenses that the owner of the bicycle failed to pay within a designated time frame, where the seller is a business licensed to repair bicycles.".

- The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.
