53	protected bicycle lane or cycle track on that road segment when DDOT engages in any road

55	extent feasible, DDOT shall make efforts to ensure the bicycle lanes and cycle tracks constructed	
56	are contiguous with other portions of the bicycle lanes and cycle tracks that are already

58	"(b)(1) At least 60 days before construction begins, the Mayor shall provide notice to	
59	affected parties, the affected Advisory Neighborhood Commissions, and the Councilmembers of
