Enclosed for consideration and approval by the Council of the District of Columbia is proposed emergency legislation, the "Contract No. DCCB-2019-C-0008 with May Firm/EKM Association on PCBs Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2019" and accompanying emergency declaration resolution ("legislation") to approve the award of proposed contract DCCB-2019-C-0008 with the May Firm/EKM Association on PCBs.

The not-to-exceed contract amount is twenty-six million dollars (\$26,000,000). The base period of performance is from date of award through five years thereafter.

The Office of the Attorney General requires the services of the contractor to provide outside legal counsel in support of the Office of the Attorney General's investigation and potential litigation against Monsanto, Solutia Inc., Pharmacia LLC, and/or any other subsidiary, affiliate or successor-in-interest responsible for the former manufacture and sale of polychlorinated biphenyls ("PCBs"), for recoupment of costs under common law or statutory theories of cost recovery, associated with the investigation and remediation of PCBs in or on lands or waters owned, controlled or held in trust by the District. The services will be delivered through four law firms that have joined together as the May Firm/EKM Association on PCBs.

A BILL

To approve, on an emergency basis, multi-year Contract No. DCCB-2019-C-0008 with the May Firm/EKM Association on PCBs to provide outside legal counsel in support of the Office of the Attorney General's investigations and potential litigation against Monsanto, Solutia Inc., Pharmacia LLC. and any other subsidiary, affiliate or successor-in-interest responsible for the former manufacture and sale of polychlorinated biphenyls ("PCBs"), for recoupment of costs and damages under common law or statutory theories of cost recovery associated with the investigation and remediation of PCBs in or on lands or waters owned controlled or held in trust by the District, or for which the District is or may be held responsible, by an agency of the federal government, any other governmental entity including a State or municipality, or third parties and to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under

the contract.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA,

That this act may be cited as the "Contract No. DCCB-2019-C-0008 with the May

Firm/EKM Association on PCBs Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act

of 2019".

- 12 Official Code§ 1-301.47a).
- 13 Sec. 4. This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the
- event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain
- in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the
- District of Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act,
