

A CEREMONIAL RESOLUTION

COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To recognize Ms. Tara Morrison, for her years of service to the National Park Service and her more recent contribution to the District of Columbia as the superintendent of Rock Creek Park.

WHEREAS, Ms. Morrison assumed the role of superintendent of Rock Creek Park March 31st 2011;

WHEREAS, she began her career with the National Parks Service in 1998 as a park ranger at Boston African American National Historic Site;

WHEREAS, she joined the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Program as the Northeast Region coordinator, providing advice and subject matter expertise toward the implementation of the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom Act;

WHEREAS, for the past ten years Ms. Morrison served as superintendent of African Burial Ground National Monument in lower Manhattan, a 6.6 acre site where free and enslaved African Americans were buried;

WHEREAS, there she developed the Park's first general management plan, maintained a \$2 million dollar budget, and oversaw a \$5.2 million dollar visitor center;

WHEREAS, previously, Ms. Morrison served in the Northeast Regional Office leading the African Burial Ground Assistance Project coordinating with various National Park Service offices and General Service Administration regarding the development of a memorial and interpretative center at the monument;

WHEREAS, previously Ms. Morrison served as acting assistant superintendent at Gateway National Recreation Area in Sandy Hook, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Morrison holds a Bachelor of Arts in African American studies from Northeastern University in Boston, a graduate certificate in museum management, and a Masters in Anthropology from the University of South Carolina;

- RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Ms. Tara Morrison Ceremonial Recognition Resolution of 2016".
