26 To recognize and honor LaShada Ham-Campbell for her contributions and service in educating
27 the youth and residents of Ward 5 and the District of Columbia.

29 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell was born and raised in Ward 5 and is a life-long
30 resident of the District of Columbia;

32 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell grew up on the 2900 block of 12th St., NE and
33 attended Brookland Elementary, Wilson High School, and graduated from Coolidge Senior High
34 School with the class of 1994;

36 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell attended and graduated from Howard University in
37 1998 with a Bachelor of Science and a Master's degree in Educational Psychology in 2001, and a
38 Master of School Administration from Trinity Washington University;

40 WHEREAS, from 2002 until 2004, LaShada Ham-Campbell taught elementary school as
41 a math specialist with Teach for America;

43 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell worked for DC Public Schools as a 2nd grade
44 teacher and math specialist;

46 WHEREAS, in 2005, LaShada Ham-Campbell became a Resident Principal and then
47 Principal of Raymond Education Campus from 2006 until 2010;

49 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell became Principal of the Center City Public Charter
50 School – Petworth Campus from 2011 until 2013;

52 WHEREAS, LaShada Ham-Campbell followed her passion for education by opening up
53 Petit Scholars, located at 12th Street and Hamlin Street, NE;

55 WHEREAS, the location of her first Petit Scholars was the same location where the
56 former store owner provided LaShada and her family credit to purchase food when her family
57 did not have the means;

59 WHEREAS, Petit Scholars has expanded to three locations, all based in Ward 5,
60 including: Petit Scholars South at the corner of 12th and Hamlin, NE, Petit Scholars North,
61 located at 10th Street, NE, and the third, located along Rhode Island Avenue, Woodridge, NE;

63 WHEREAS, Petit Scholars strives to provide children with care, guidance, respect, and a
64 beautiful environment; and

66 WHEREAS, Petit Scholars serves more than 60 families and continues to grow in size.

68 RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, that this
69 resolution may be cited as the “LaShada Ham-Campbell Petit Scholars Ceremonial Resolution of
70 2019”.
