Enclosed for consideration and approval by the Council of the District of Columbia is proposed emergency legislation, the "Award and Modifications to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 with National Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Act of 2019" to approve the award and Modification Nos. 1, 2, 4, and 5 to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 to provide structured training, community outreach and related supportive services developed for a violence reduction program by CURE Violence.

Council action is necessary to approve the awards and modifications in the not-to-exceed amount of \$986,448.73 for the period July 27, 2018 through April 30, 2019 and \$1,393,268.59 for the period May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020.

The Office of the Attorney General, Public Safety Division, requires the services of the non-profit community-based organization to provide high quality, structured training, community outreach and related supportive services developed for a violence interruption program by Cure Violence® in targeted neighborhoods in Ward 5 and Ward 8.

A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to approve the award of and Modification Nos. 1, 2, 4, and 5 to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 with the National Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens to provide structured training, community outreach and related supportive services developed for a violence reduction program by CURE Violence and to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under the under the Human Care Agreement modifications and Human Care Agreement award.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Award and Modifications to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 with National Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens Approval and Payment Authorization Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2019”.

Sec. 2. (a) There exists a need to approve the award of and Modification Nos. 1, 2, 4 and 5 to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 with the National Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens to provide structured training, community outreach and related supportive services developed for a violence reduction program by CURE Violence and

1 to authorize payment for the goods and services received and to be received under the
2 under the Human Care Agreement modifications and Human Care Agreement award.

3 (b) On July 27, 2018, the Office of the Attorney General (“OAG”), executed
4 Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A in the amount not-to-exceed \$337,570.00
5 for the period from July 27, 2018 through September 30, 2018.

6 (c) By Modification No. 1, the Office of Attorney General (“OAG”), increased
7 the amount of Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A to an amount not-to-exceed
8 \$785,755.02 for the period from July 27, 2018 through January 31, 2019.

9 (c) By Modification No. 3, OAG, further increased the amount of Human Care
10 Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A to an amount not-to-exceed \$808,611.28 for the period
11 from July 27, 2018 through February 28, 2019.

12 (d) By Modification No. 4, OAG, further increased the amount of Human Care
13 Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A to an amount not-to-exceed \$894,766.44 through
14 March 31, 2019.

15 (e) By Modification No. 5, OAG, further increased the amount of Human Care
16 Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A to an amount not-to-exceed \$980,902.39 through April
17 30, 2019.

18 (f) Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 is now necessary to continue
19 similar services performed under Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-0007A for an
20 additional year in the amount of \$1,393,269.59 for the period from May 1, 2019 through
21 April 30, 2020, raising the total amount of both human care agreements for services
22 developed for a violence reduction program by CURE Violence to a not-to-exceed
23 amount of \$2,374,171.98.

1 (f) Council approval is required by section 451(b) of the District of Columbia
2 Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 803; D.C. Official Code § 1-
3 204.51(b)) since these modifications and new award increase the human care agreements
4 for services developed for a violence reduction program by CURE Violence to more than
5 \$1,000,000 during a 12-month period.

6 (g) Approval is necessary to allow the continuation of these vital services.
7 Without this approval, National Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens
8 cannot be paid for goods and services provided in excess of \$1,000,000 for the contract
9 period May 1, 2019 through April 30, 2020.

10 Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the
11 circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it
12 necessary that the “Award and Modifications to Human Care Agreement OAG-FY18-H-
13 0007A and award of Human Care Agreement DCCB-2019-H-0007 with National
14 Association for the Advancement of Returning Citizens Approval and Payment
15 Authorization Emergency Act of 2019” be adopted after a single reading.

16 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
