IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

November 7, 2023

To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to amend An Act To establish a code of law for the District of Columbia to authorize the Mayor to issue marriage licenses and authorize temporary marriage officiants during a period of time when the Clerk of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia is not issuing marriage licenses because of a federal government shutdown.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Let Our Vows Endure (LOVE) Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2023".

- Sec. 2. (a) Under current law, marriage licenses are issued by the Clerk of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia ("Clerk").
- (b) During a federal government shutdown, the Clerk does not issue marriage licenses because the issuance of marriage licenses is considered a non-essential function of the Superior Court.
- (c) In such circumstances, District residents and others celebrating their marriages in the District are unable to obtain marriage licenses.
- (d) The inability of District residents and others celebrating their marriages in the District to obtain a marriage license can be highly disruptive to personal lives, particularly where a marriage has been planned to occur soon.
- (e) Given the current potential for a federal government shutdown, it is imperative that District law be amended to enable the Mayor to issue marriage licenses during a federal government shutdown so that District residents and others celebrating their marriages in the District may legally solemnize their marriages at the time of their choosing.
- Sec. 3. The Council determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Let Our Vows Endure (LOVE) Emergency Amendment Act of 2023 be adopted after a single reading.
 - Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
