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purposes of this subsection, "other pharmaceutical services" 17 means the monitoring of the patient's drug therapy and assisting 18 19 the patient in the management of his or her drug therapy, and 20 includes review and recommendations made in of the patient's 21 drug therapy and communication with the patient's prescribing 22 health care provider as licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, 23 chapter 461, or chapter 466, or a similar statutory provision in 24 another jurisdiction, or such provider's agent or such other persons as specifically authorized by the patient, regarding the 25 26 patient's drug therapy and health care status. However, nothing in this subsection may not be interpreted to permit an 27 28 alteration of a prescriber's directions, the diagnosis or 29 treatment of any disease, the initiation of any drug therapy, 30 the practice of medicine, or the practice of osteopathic medicine, unless otherwise permitted by law. "Practice of the 31 32 profession of pharmacy" also includes any other act, service, 33 operation, research, or transaction incidental to, or forming a 34 part of, any of the foregoing acts, requiring, involving, or 35 employing the science or art of any branch of the pharmaceutical 36 profession, study, or training, and shall expressly permit a 37 pharmacist to transmit information from persons authorized to prescribe medicinal drugs to their patients. To be licensed as a consultant pharmacist, a 57 pharmacist must complete additional training as required by the 58 board. 59 (a) A consultant pharmacist may provide medication 60 management services within the framework of a collaborative 61 practice agreement between the pharmacist and a health care 62 facility medical director or a physician licensed under chapter 63 458 or chapter 459, a podiatric physician licensed under chapter 461, or a dentist licensed under chapter 466, who is authorized 64 to prescribe medicinal drugs. 65

67	circumstances under which the consultant pharmacist may:
68	1. Order and evaluate any laboratory or clinical tests to
69	promote and evaluate patient health and wellness, and monitor
70	drug therapy and treatment outcomes.
71	2. Conduct patient assessments as appropriate to evaluate
72	and monitor drug therapy.
73	3. Initiate, modify, or discontinue medicinal drugs as
74	outlined in the agreed upon patient-specific order or
75	preapproved treatment protocol under the direction of a
76	physician. A consultant pharmacist may not modify or discontinue
77	medicinal drugs prescribed by a health care practitioner who
78	does not have a collaborative practice agreement with the
79	consultant pharmacist.
80	4. Administer medicinal drugs.
81	<u>(c) A</u> <del>The</del> consultant pharmacist shall <u>maintain</u> <del>be</del>
82	responsible for maintaining all drug, patient care, and quality
83	assurance records as required by law and, with the collaborating
84	practitioner, shall maintain collaborative practice agreements
85	that must be available upon request from or upon inspection by
86	the department.
87	(d) Nothing in the subsection may be construed to
88	authorize a consultant pharmacist to diagnose any disease or
89	condition.
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90	(e) For purposes of this subsection, the term "health care
91	facility" means an ambulatory surgical center or hospital
92	licensed under chapter 395, an alcohol or chemical dependency
93	treatment center licensed under chapter 397, an inpatient
94	hospice licensed under part IV of chapter 400, a nursing home
95	licensed under part II of chapter 400, an ambulatory care center
96	as defined in s. 408.07, or a nursing home component under
97	chapter 400 within a continuing care facility licensed under
98	chapter 651. for establishing drug handling procedures for the
99	safe handling and storage of drugs. The consultant pharmacist
100	may also be responsible for ordering and evaluating any
101	laboratory or clinical testing when, in the judgment of the
102	consultant pharmacist, such activity is necessary for the proper
103	performance of the consultant pharmacist's responsibilities.
104	Such laboratory or clinical testing may be ordered only with
105	regard to patients residing in a nursing home facility, and then
106	only when authorized by the medical director of the nursing home
107	facility. The consultant pharmacist must have completed such
108	additional training and demonstrate such additional
109	qualifications in the practice of institutional pharmacy as
110	shall be required by the board in addition to licensure as a
111	registered pharmacist.
112	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a
113	consultant pharmacist or a doctor of pharmacy licensed in this
114	state may also be responsible for ordering and evaluating any
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115 laboratory or clinical testing for persons under the care of a 116 licensed home health agency when, in the judgment of the 117 consultant pharmacist or doctor of pharmacy, such activity is 118 necessary for the proper performance of his or her 119 responsibilities and only when authorized by a practitioner licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 461, or chapter 120 466.
