Section 937.0205, Florida Statutes, is created 66 67 to read: 68 937.0205 At-Risk Adult Alert Plan.-69 The Legislature finds that a standardized state system (1) 70 is necessary to aid in the search for a missing adult who has an 71 irreversible cognitive disorder or syndrome or brain injury, 72 including, but not limited to, a developmental disability or an intellectual disability, as those terms are defined in s. 73 74 393.063, whose disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's welfare and safety, and who does not meet the criteria 75

162 (d) The presumption of good faith is not overcome if a technical or clerical error is made by any agency, employee, 163 164 individual, or entity acting at the request of the local law 165 enforcement agency having jurisdiction, or if the Amber Alert, 166 Missing Child Alert, missing child information, missing adult 167 information, or Silver Alert, or At-Risk Adult Alert information 168 is incomplete or incorrect because the information received from 169 the local law enforcement agency was incomplete or incorrect.

(e) Neither this subsection nor any other provision of law
creates a duty of the agency, employee, individual, or entity to
record, report, transmit, display, or release the Amber Alert,
Missing Child Alert, missing child information, missing adult
information, or Silver Alert, or At-Risk Adult Alert information
received from the local law enforcement agency having

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jurisdiction. The decision to record, report, transmit, display,
or release information is discretionary with the agency,
employee, individual, or entity receiving the information.

Any person having knowledge may submit a missing 190 endangered person report to the clearinghouse concerning a child 191 or adult younger than 26 years of age whose whereabouts is 192 unknown, regardless of the circumstances, subsequent to 193 reporting such child or adult missing to the appropriate law 194 enforcement agency within the county in which the child or adult 195 became missing, and subsequent to entry by the law enforcement 196 agency of the child or person into the Florida Crime Information 197 Center and the National Crime Information Center databases. The 198 missing endangered person report shall be included in the clearinghouse database. 199

3. Only the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction

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201 over the case may submit a missing endangered person report to 202 the clearinghouse involving a missing adult age 26 years or 203 older who is suspected by a law enforcement agency of being 204 endangered or the victim of criminal activity.

4. Only the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction
over the case may make a request to the clearinghouse for the
activation of a state Silver Alert <u>or At-Risk Adult Alert</u>
involving a missing adult if circumstances regarding the
disappearance have met the criteria for activation of the Silver
Alert <u>or At-Risk Adult Alert</u> Plan.

(d) Each employee hired on or after July 1, 2012, who
provides direct care to ADRD participants, must receive and
