CS/HB 321 2020

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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to evictions during emergency conditions; amending s. 83.62, F.S.; prohibiting a sheriff from serving or executing a writ of possession until a specified time on certain premises that are under a hurricane watch or hurricane warning; tolling the notice period for a writ of possession issued on certain premises that are under a hurricane watch or hurricane warning; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 83.62, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
  - 83.62 Restoration of possession to landlord.-
- (1) In an action for possession, after entry of judgment in favor of the landlord, the clerk shall issue a writ to the sheriff describing the premises and commanding the sheriff to put the landlord in possession after 24 hours' notice conspicuously posted on the premises.
- (a) The sheriff may not serve or execute a writ of possession on a premises in a county that is under a hurricane watch or hurricane warning issued by the National Weather Service until 5 days after the termination of the hurricane watch or hurricane warning.

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CODING: Words stricken are deletions; words underlined are additions.

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(b) Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays do not stay the
24-hour notice period. However, if the premises is located in a
county that is under a hurricane watch or hurricane warning
issued by the National Weather Service, the 24-hour notice
period is tolled until 5 days after the termination of the
hurricane watch or hurricane warning.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
