(3) Vehicles of the fire department and fire patrol,
including vehicles of volunteer firefighters as permitted under
s. 316.2398, may show or display red, blue, or red and white
lights. However, blue lights may only be shown or displayed on
the rear of vehicles described in paragraph (2) (b).

33 <u>(a)</u> Vehicles of volunteer fire departments and volunteer 34 <u>firefighters</u>, medical staff physicians or technicians of medical 35 facilities licensed by the state or of volunteer ambulance 36 services as authorized under s. 316.2398, ambulances as 37 authorized under this chapter, and buses and taxicabs as 38 authorized under s. 316.2399 may show or display red lights.

51 emergency vehicles of governmental departments or public service 52 corporations may show or display amber lights when in actual 53 operation or when a hazard exists provided they are not used going to and from the scene of operation or hazard without 54 55 specific authorization of a law enforcement officer or law 56 enforcement agency. Wreckers must use amber rotating or flashing 57 lights while performing recoveries and loading on the roadside 58 day or night, and may use such lights while towing a vehicle on 59 wheel lifts, slings, or under reach if the operator of the wrecker deems such lights necessary. A flatbed, car carrier, or 60 rollback may not use amber rotating or flashing lights when 61 hauling a vehicle on the bed unless it creates a hazard to other 62 63 motorists because of protruding objects. Further, escort 64 vehicles may show or display amber lights when in the actual 65 process of escorting overdimensioned equipment, material, or 66 buildings as authorized by law.

67 <u>(d)</u> Vehicles owned or leased by private security agencies 68 may show or display green and amber lights, with either color 69 being no greater than 50 percent of the lights displayed, while 70 the security personnel are engaged in security duties on private 71 or public property.

The term does not include wreckers, utility 82 trucks, or other vehicles that are used only incidentally for 83 emergency purposes.
