Section 455.33, Florida Statutes, is created to 34 read: 35 455.33 Course requirement on the detection of human 36 trafficking.-37 (1) All of the following businesses in the state must 38 certify to the Department of Business and Professional 39 Regulation on a form developed by the department that each of its employees has completed at least a one hour course on the 40 41 detection of human trafficking developed by the Florida Forensic 42 Institute for Research, Security, and Tactics: 43 (a) A business that employs a driver who delivers goods to 44 private residences. 45 (b) A business that employs a person who enters private 46 residences for any purpose, including, but not limited to, 47 maintenance, technical assistance, or painting. 48 (2) (a) The Florida Forensic Institute for Research, 49 Security, and Tactics must develop and make available the course 50 on the detection of human trafficking by January 1, 2021.

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(b) All employees working for a business under subsection (1) on or before January 1, 2021, must complete the course and certify such completion to the department by July 1, 2021. For employees working for such a business after January 1, 2021, the course must be completed and certified to the department within 60 days of employment.

Section 2. Section 488.01, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 488.01 License to engage in business of operating a driver school required.—
- (1) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles shall oversee and license all commercial driver schools except truck driving schools. All commercial truck driving schools shall be required to be licensed pursuant to chapter 1005, and additionally shall be subject to subsection (2) and the provisions of ss. 488.04 and 488.05. No person, group, organization, institution, business entity, or corporate entity may engage in the business of operating a driver school without first obtaining a license therefor from the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles pursuant to this chapter or from the Commission for Independent Education pursuant to chapter 1005.
- (2) Except for commercial driver schools or curriculum offered only for school bus drivers, all commercial driver schools, including all commercial truck driving schools, must

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offer as part of their curriculum either of the following:

- (a) A human trafficking prevention course administered by the Department of Law Enforcement or by an organization that is approved by the Department of Law Enforcement to present such a course. The Department of Law Enforcement shall adopt rules to develop and implement the human trafficking prevention course by January 1, 2021.
- (b) The Certified Truckers Against Trafficking

 Certification Program, which is offered online by Truckers

 Against Trafficking, a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.
- Section 3. Subsection (4) of section 1012.45, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 1012.45 School bus drivers; requirements and duties.-
- (4) Each district school board may provide a school bus driver training program and may make this program available to private school bus drivers by contract. If a district school board provides a school bus driver training program, 40 minutes of the program must be allocated to the Busing on the Lookout training offered by Truckers Against Trafficking, a s. 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.
